

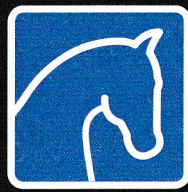

FAECAL EGG COUNT SAMPLE COLLECTION

!Fresh manure is important, as eggs deteriorate with time and temperature!

Collect 2 balls of fresh Faeces (no more than 12 hours old) from your horse's paddock/yard/stable. Ideally collect the sample immediately after your horse has passed it. If you are not sure, but a pile looks fresh, collect the sample from the middle of the pile where it is still moist.

Place the sample in a zip-lock bag or small disposable container. Write your full name, horse's name, age, date and time collected on the bag/container.

Keep the sample in a cool bag with an ice pack if possible, until the sample is given to your vet.

Following analysis, results and advice will be provided to you by one of our veterinarian's.
