A Vision for Nillumbik's Green Wedge

'Management of the Nillumbik green wedge will lead the way in supporting a vibrant, resilient, connected and diverse community; living in the landscape to enhance the environmental, social and economic sustainability of the Shire.'

Do you agree with the vision for Nillumbik's Green Wedge?

As this vision does not provide any clarity or direction of the desired future of the green wedge land and landscape, and the natural environment, biodiversity and agricultural values it supports, I cannot agree with this vision. Remarkably this draft Nillumbik GWMP has rendered the Nillumbik Green Wedge itself almost invisible. The Green Wedge is the land and the landscape of the green wedge (the place). Management of the Green Wedge is done by the people who are connected to it, and custodians of it (the people). The draft GWMP needs to firstly articulate what is desired for the place, based on an analysis of its values, set a desired future for the place, and then determine how management can achieve the desired future. Plan Melbourne lists Green Wedge Management Plans as one of the tools to protect green wedge land. Plan Melbourne states that "As Melbourne grows, planning for Melbourne's green wedges and periurban areas is required to: • protect biodiversity assets, including national and state parks, Ramsar wetlands and coastal areas • support existing and potential agribusiness activities, forestry, food production and tourism • (four more) The purpose of the green wedge vision therefore should be to describe the desired future for the place and the people - what the land, landscape, and its values look like, and what people and

organisations are doing as its custodians. I acknowledge that the vision is almost identical to that proposed by the community panel, with one curious change - what was "...living with the landscape..." has been changed to "...living in the landscape..." which has major implications for the natural environment and agriculture. Why was it changed? However, this vision does not even attempt to describe the desired future of the green wedge land and landscape and the biodiversity and agricultural values it supports, and therefore is fundamentally flawed as a vision for the green wedge. Appendix 1 of Council's draft quotes the State Government's 'Plan Melbourne 2017-2050', where an explicit desired planning outcome for Green Wedges is to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." The Nillumbik Green Wedge Management Plan Community Engagement Report reports that the key findings for the question: "What I like about the Green Wedge" were: • Space, peace and wellbeing - this related particularly to how the Green Wedge made people feel, an appreciation of views and fresh air along with the less stressful environment. • Environment, biodiversity, plants and animals - this related to the importance of the natural environment for plants and animals as well as humans So why are these community values such a small component of the draft Nillumbik GWMP?

As these key moves are vaguely written, leaving the reader unclear as to exactly what council is proposing to do, I disagree that they will support the delivery of the green wedge management plan. The 'five key moves' are simply five actions lifted from the

actions listed under the goal "Responsible leadership" (and a few other places). They are described as things Council will do to achieve the community panel's recommendations yet make no attempt to explain how. These actions, as well as many of the other actions, are written so vaguely they leave the reader unclear as to exactly what Council is actually proposing to do, who has responsibility for delivery, what resources are needed, and when they will be done.

Even though I support much of the sentiment in what is written, I disagree that these principles as written can/will guide implementation of the GWMP. Principles are the guiding rules or values that underpin decision-making around the GWMP and help

decision-makers determine if potential actions are rightful or wrongful. Many of the listed 'principles', although their intent is good, are not written in a way that they can be used as principles, eg: "Aboriginal voice: we have much to learn from our first peoples, particularly about caring for country". Yes, we do have much to learn, but as written this is not a principle that can underpin decision-making.

Goal 1: Engaged connected communities

Landowners, Council and other parts of the community all have a role to play in managing the green wedge, however in the absence of an agreed and shared view of what the green wedge land, landscape, natural environment and agriculture should be like in the future, and how the community should be acting as custodians of the land, I cannot support the objective or key actions for Goal 1 Clear, shared goals for the Green Wedge land and landscape, consistent with the purpose of green wedges and coupled with a culture of shared custodianship across the community, is what is needed to effectively engage the community in management of the green wedge. Clarity of purpose is also essential when seeking to establish strategic partnerships with regional and state agencies. This draft GWMP does not deliver on this front. Page 22 of the draft GWMP suggests "These constraints may have to be re-examined.." in relation to concentrating new housing within townships, but does not clarify what the constraints are, nor which need to be 're-examined'. Hopefully it is not considering moving the UGB or directing new housing outside of the designated township boundaries. The Victorian Planning Provision 11.1-1R Green Wedges – Metropolitan Melbourne states the strategy: Consolidate new residential development in existing settlements and in locations where planned services are available and green wedge values are protected". The overt push in the draft GWMP to accommodate people within the green wedge as they age is a risk to unnecessarily increasing housing within the green wedge. The Nillumbik Green Wedge Management Plan Community Engagement Report makes no mention of "..a growing need to support ageing people continue to live on and manage their land" that appears in the draft GWMP. The Nillumbik Green Wedge Management

Plan Community Engagement Report states that around 280 responses of a total of 418 to the question: "Do you have any other comments about the Green Wedge?" were "Maintain/don't stuff it up". This draft GWMP would do nothing other than stuff it up!

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

This goal struggles to have any logical connection to management of the green wedge, and again in the absence of a an agreed and shared view of what the green wedge land, landscape, natural environment and agriculture should be like in the future, and how the community are acting as custodians of the land, I cannot support the objective or key actions for Goal 2. Bizarrely, Landcare is listed as a 'recreational activity' on page 26! Landcare is a volunteer-based movement of private landholders working together to care for the land and environment they share. I agree that health and wellbeing is strongly linked to nature and natural environments, making it all the more important to be clear on what these assets are, their distribution and condition, and the extent and condition we want them to have in the future. Working with the Wurundjeri people should not be limited to local heritage protection (Objective 02.5) but extend to sustained dialogue and relationship building to enable restoration of traditional practices, and a building of a culture of custodianship inherent in the green wedge's Traditional Owners. There is no reasoning given for the action A2.7 that proposes to allow prohibited uses!

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Do not Support

This is the only place in the document where the natural environment gets a mention, and it still does not attempt to describe what the desired future for our natural environment in the green wedge should be. Until this is established and agreed on, we cannot know what outcome we are managing for. As such, I cannot support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3 This and other parts of the document uses language of opposition and compromise when talking about "..a need for balanced outcomes" and "Balancing environmental protection and preparedness for bushfire.." The wording is incongruous – goal is "Safe and healthy environments", sub-heading is "Healthy and safe communities enjoy living in our iconic green wedge environment" – is it the health of the environment or the community that this goal is aimed at? Nowhere does it say that the natural environment needs to be made and kept healthy, let alone what that might look like. More significantly, this draft GWMP is putting the cart before

the horse – the first key action talks about undertaking stocktakes of environmental assets and agricultural activity and practices that need to be protected for the future. This needs to be completed before their management, and therefore the GWMP, can be determined, as it will provide critical evidence of what we currently have, enable us to determine what condition we want it to be in in the future, and how we need to manage the green wedge to get there. This then provides the focus and purpose for promoting and supporting environmental care and community custodianship.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Creating a prosperous economy is not the primary role of this or any green wedge, it is to protect biodiversity assets and support existing and potential agribusiness activities. In affording this protection, one can seek to enable viable businesses that contribute to the local economy, in particular those directly related to regenerative agricultural production and eco-tourism. I cannot support this goal, it objectives or actions in the absence of a clear and community-supported desired future for the natural environment and agriculture in the green wedge. The need for a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices is described in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, entitled 'Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan', and so this has to be clearly demonstrated in any GWMP. This current draft does not achieve this requirement. With the recognition of the vital importance of green wedges as Melbourne's food bowl, cleared rural land in the Nillumbik green wedge needs to be protected from actions and uses that may restrict or remove their potential to be used for agricultural production in the future. This also includes lot sizes that are large enough to sustain viable agriculture. The principle of avoiding breaking up larger lots into smaller parcels and encouraging the consolidation of smaller lots is supported. Horses are described as an agricultural product on page 36. What form of food or fibre (the outputs of agriculture) is produced from horses? Horse keeping, undertaken in an environmentally sensitive and sustainable manner, should only be seen as a form of land use that does not prevent potential future agricultural use of the land. Grazing of understorey vegetation and direct access to waterways (by horses, and stock) is not environmentally sensitive and sustainable. The notion of the "right to farm" without constraint is not supported. Agriculture is allowed in Rural Conservation Zones but given the extensive important natural environment values across the Nillumbik green wedge, it is most appropriate that there is a checking process (ie permit) for only allowing sustainable forms of agriculture that will not adversely impact on the natural environment.

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5?

Council's leadership does need to be responsible, and its decisions need to be evidence-based and made in the interests of the state, wider Melbourne as well as the community of Nillumbik, and our green wedge land and landscape, especially its natural environment, biodiversity and agriculture. It also needs to help develop a community culture of custodianship of these assets. Council needs to hold the big picture perspective and responsibly apply its position, influence and powers to ensure this is translated to the local and property scale. In the absence of a clear and agreed desired future for the natural environment and agriculture in the green wedge to guide decisionmaking, I cannot support goal 5 and its actions. Action A5.6 proposes to apply zoning controls based on current land uses. This is back to front - the zoning controls are there to guide and manage the land uses such that they achieve the desired goals, not the land uses dictating what the zoning controls should be. Action A5.2 proposes an organisational approach based on compromise requiring 'robust conversations', rather than a solution-focused approach that unifies rather than divides an organisation. A solution-focused approach for managing the complexities of the green wedge however needs clear desired outcomes for the natural environment and biodiversity values, and agriculture, that unfortunately are absent from this draft GWMP.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

Four main overall points: 1. The draft Nillumbik GWMP has lost sight of, or ignored, the purpose of green wedges, which is to, amongst other things, protect biodiversity assets, and support existing and potential agribusiness activities Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 states: "...planning for green wedge and peri-urban areas should: • define and protect areas that are strategically important to the metropolitan area and the state, for the environment, biodiversity, landscape, open space, water, agriculture, energy, recreation, tourism, environment, cultural heritage, infrastructure, extractive and other natural resources • protect and manage the value of green wedges consistent with green wedge management plans" The Victorian Planning Provisions Clause 51.02 'Metropolitan Green Wedge Land: Core Planning Provisions' states the objectives: • To protect metropolitan green wedge land from uses and development that would diminish its agricultural, environmental, cultural heritage, conservation, landscape natural resource or recreation values. • To protect productive agricultural land from incompatible uses and development The draft Nillumbik GWMP does not appear to see these as the purpose of the Nillumbik green wedge. 2. The draft Nillumbik GWMP has rendered the Nillumbik Green Wedge itself almost invisible! The Green Wedge is the land and the

landscape of the green wedge. Management of the Green Wedge is done by the people who are connected to, and custodians of, it. Yet the draft GWMP makes no attempt to provide an analysis of the biodiversity, agricultural and other values of the green wedge. nor to articulate what is the desired future for the green wedge land and landscape essential ingredients for determining management, in fact the land and the landscape rarely get a mention. 3. The Victorian Government has produced the Planning Practice Note 31 "Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan" and Council even provides this document on their website, yet they have not followed substantial sections of this guidance. The practice note describes what a green wedge management plan is, as follows: • A Green Wedge Management Plan is a council adopted strategy that identifies a vision, objectives and actions for the sustainable use and development of each green wedge. The plan will identify the values and features of each green wedge, the preferred future land use, environmental and natural resources that should be protected, and the needs of the local community. Green wedges, like any other place are dynamic and constantly evolving. Changes identified through the preparation of GWMPs may embrace new productive land uses, investments and developments consistent with state policies for green wedges, environmental enhancement and sustainable resource management initiatives The draft Nillumbik GWMP does not identify the values and features of the Nillumbik green wedge, the preferred future land uses, or the environmental and natural resources that should be protected. The practice note also states: • Opportunities in the green wedge include: o agricultural uses, such as market gardening, viticulture and broad acre farming, as well as forestry and land-based aquaculture o assisting the preservation of rural and scenic landscapes o ensuring the conservation of important environmental assets close to where people live o (others) The draft Nillumbik GWMP does not identify any of these as opportunities to pursue. The practice note goes on to state: • The key task of a GWMP is to articulate the type, scale and form of change in the green wedge and how those changes will be managed and facilitated. The draft Nillumbik GWMP does not articulate any future for the green wedge, let alone the type, scale and form of desired change (curiously this key task was included in a FAQ sheet published by Council on their website as part of the GWMP review!) The practice note continues with: • In summary, a GWMP should: o Develop a vision, role and purpose for the green wedge. This should be determined through community consultation and research. o Identify the values and features within the green wedge that are to be protected and enhanced. This should be based on a detailed environmental and land use inventory and community consultation o Establish a strategic direction for land use and development within the green wedge that is consistent with government policies and strategies that will protect and enhance the values and features identified within the green wedge. This should be based on identification of key opportunities and constraints identified through research The draft Nillumbik GWMP has not conducted any research in developing the vision, and it does not articulate a role or purpose for the Nillumbik green wedge. The practice note states five principles that should underpin the preparation of a GWMP, including: • A GWMP should be consistent with relevant state government policies and strategies • A GWMP should be prepared in partnership with government and councils, in their role as the funding agencies implementing government policies, and with landowners and the

community, in their role as the custodians of the area who have a duty of care for the resource base • A GWMP should reflect the regional and local circumstances and needs of each green wedge, as well as the circumstances and needs that are shared with other relevant green wedge areas. It should provide a clear purpose that council is able and willing to implement and defend. The draft Nillumbik GWMP is not consistent with relevant state government policies, has not involved state government in its preparation, and does not provide a clear purpose for the Nillumbik green wedge. The practice note goes on to state: • Council should establish a project steering group (chaired by the council), with representatives from key stakeholders to oversee the preparation of the plan The draft Nillumbik GWMP did not establish a project steering group with representatives from key stakeholders (eg DELWP – the practice note states: Department officers are available to assist councils in the preparation of a GWMP) 4. Council has put the cart before the horse by drafting a management plan for the green wedge, with no attempt to undertake the research and detailed environmental and land use inventory that is needed to help identify the values and features that are to be protected and enhanced - the green wedge itself. What has been presented in the draft Nillumbik GWMP is a plan to manage something there is no information on, nor what it is wanted to be like in the future as a result of the management.

Although in part I agree with the Vision, my concern is the draft GWMP forecasts an enormous change to Nillumbik's Green Wedge.

The Actions within the Goals have a strong focus on Reforming Nillumbik's Planning Scheme through rezoning individual parcels of land from Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) to Green Wedge Zone (GWZ), changes to the Local Planning Policy Framework (LPPF) including the Municipal Strategic Statement (MSS), changes to the Local Planning Provisions (LPP) and advocating changes to the Victorian Planning Provisions (VPP) which I assume is the table template to the zones.

These changes will come with consequences and usually to the unsuspecting rural residents. It WILL introduce currently Prohibited uses under the RCZ if changed to GWZ. An example of what could be developed next door to a lifestyle/hobby farm with a few grazing animals is:

Section 2 uses: FUNCTION CENTRES, EXHIBITION CENTRES, MAJOR SPORTS AND RECREATION CENTRES, PLACES OF WORSHIP and other Nesting Groups

which will also trigger other permit requirements and although they can be of benefit to the community, they can often be inappropriately places in the rural areas. These intense uses can operate 7 days a week with hours from 6am to Midnight and have 1,000's of patrons each day.

This is currently happening in other Green Wedge Shires on GWZ land next to quiet hobby farms or agricultural farms.

Although I realise a rezoning may be fit in some cases for a current Agricultural purpose, I don't believe the community has been or is being informed that other potential uses with serious amenity impacts can occur next to them with a Green Wedge Zoning.

The relaxing of the LPPF and LPP will give further weight for these uses to be approved by Council or VCAT and the in conjunction with agriculture is easy overcome and often proven unnecessary in particular with the majority of the uses without a condition in the zone table (clause 35.04) or CPP (clause 51.02).

Obviously these changes would be implemented through planning scheme amendments, which is an expensive and lengthy process and once again community consultation.

So the question is, how will council deal with this?

They should be through a separate plan in a Review of the Planning Scheme as part of the Ministerial Direction.

After reading the Draft Consultation material I am really concerned about the total disregard for current local businesses operating in Hurstbridge and surrounds. Firstly I think everyone will agree that any Business must have several principles at the forefront. These include but not limited to: 1. Price 2. Quality 3. Customer Service When I read the Goal 4 section, A Prosperous Economy it basically ignores current small businesses located in Hurstbridge, Panton Hill, Smith's Gully and St Andrews. This area has a population of around 7,000+ and small business will always be challenged when there is such a small customer base. Critical to maintaining and growing business is to implement a marketing strategy to attract both locals and visitors to the area, and therefore to potentially grow our Businesses. The principle is simple, the more people coming through the door potentially provides the opportunity to grow sales and thus prosperity. Based on what I read I am concerned that the Nillumbik Shire is not looking to support current local small businesses. The document in question 'A Prosperous Economy' identifies "The Visitor

Economy" on page 37 of the document. It really makes no reference to small businesses located in the area of Hurstbridge. The document also includes a list of Key Actions to be undertaken Council and State Government related to a prosperous economy. Again current local businesses are not identified and basically ignored. In addition I want to make a comment about the Green Wedge, First up, it is fair to say that we all love the environment created by the Green Wedge. The environment created by the Green Wedge does attract people with intelligence and a worldly outlook. I personally love living and working in a Green Wedge environment. Having said that it does have a juxtaposition and a potential negative impact on Business. Green Wedge does not allow for subdivision and the building of new homes, and therefore a growth in population. Hence current small businesses have a limited local customer base. To grow our sales and prosperity we need more people to visit Hurstbridge and surrounds. Hurstbridge recently had the potential to see a development of Units that were eco-friendly. This was opposed by some locals and Council. I have noticed a trend in older people selling their acreage and down sizing to smaller properties. Most still wanted to live in the area but due to lack of housing they had to move away. The Unit development would have seen more families move into the area, and thus increase population. In turn this would have meant growing business opportunity for current local businesses. It is now revealed that Nillumbik Council appears to have no marketing strategy for current and local small business. To reinforce the above point, the Draft for Consultation document refers to the Nillumbik Destination Management Plan 2015 on page 38. It refers to 'opportunities' but again there is no reference to supporting current small businesses. Keep in mind that the majority of Business Owners are paying the Council rates, but Council is now deciding to provide no support for small businesses already operating in Hurstbridge and surrounds. This situation is very concerning. Can I suggest that local business owners need to work together and think big picture. We all need to become very active as a Business community and not try to address issues by working separately. I really encourage everyone to get involved with the Traders' Association. Yes, the retail economy is struggling due to credit card debt, high mortgages, and lack of wage growth. I see in the news that David Jones have just written down their value by \$437 million which has been initiated by a 'retail recession'. Based on the Green Wedge document, the Nillumbik Shire Council intend to neglect local businesses in Hurstbridge and surrounds. I would like the Council to honestly RMIT and address these with a view to some reorganization. I know they often result from historic regulations like the 1/4 acre homesites in the middle of supposed RCZs. In my area Yarrambat, not a township despite all the wasted talk over many years, there are allotments from less than 1000m square metres up to 10 or more hectares. The Plenty Corridor or land west of Yan Yean Road have been allowed to recently exist as low as 2 hectares and then with 2 dwellings whereas east of Yan Yean Rd is a different zoning.

- 3. There seems to be a false assumption that this process gathers opinions of those who live in the designated area. It does not. I was sent a letter to nominate for the process but I was unable to commit to all the Saturdays required as I expect many could not. Then this process of allowing comment is fine if you have access and feel comfortable using an online format. Hard copy written submissions can also be lodged but again that assumes a confidence and ability to write a submission. It would be interesting to know how many responses you receive from resident landowners who are not members of some interest group.
- 4. I have found that some of the loudest voices in support of keeping the green wedge in Nillumbik come from people whose property is NOT affected. You need to hear from US.

This is clearly evident in rural parts where large parcels of land remain on the market for years because of the ridiculous overlays, planning restrictions, and even more absurd interpretations on those overlays by planning officers.

Put simply, there are too many restrictions which restrict use and devalue the land. The "prior use rights" in relation to hooved animal grazing is a scam and an invasion of landowner rights.

There is way too much focus on tourism in the Draft GWMP. This is a concern. Are we intending on looking pretty to the rest of the world, at the cost of the rights of the individual land owners? It is very clear that the grand plan is to make it so difficult for hobby farmers and other agricultural users so the cleared pasture is slowly replaced by bush over the next few decades. It's not unusual for a property to have seven (7) or more overlays, and more restrictions than can be logically comprehended, so one by one, land owners will just give up. When this happens, vital fire breaks (open, clear, well managed pasture) gets overgrown by bush, tea tree and invasive species, and is "lost" forever - until the next wildfire rips through anyway.

Responsible land owners already do their job well. I believe efforts should be aimed at

cleanup and enforcement of the rubbish tip properties. They aren't hard to find. They are the ones with endless invasive weeds, erosion, endless man made waste, old machinery, car bodies, collapsed buildings, and rubbish everywhere. Make them accountable if there's such a focus on tourism

Planning schemes are far too complicated and expensive. We need simple, streamlined processes which are transparent to the applicant.

"Appendix 1: Agricultural Land", who decides what is an "incompatible use"? It's things like this which cause immense problems for landowners. It reads fantastic in a corporate board room, but in practice it could infringe the basic rights of the owner, and devalue the land. It defies logic that the owner of a piece of rural land can be micro-managed to such an extent, and the details of which remains hidden in the pages of obscure overlays.

I also have a fundamental objection to Green lobby groups who have no pecuniary interest in Nillumbik whatsoever having an influence over these things. "No name on a title - no say in it"

Hobby farming, vineyards, orchards and other non-intensive agriculture is what rural Nillumbik is made of. These people achieving great things should be respected, admired and most of all SHOULD BE CONSULTED. They are the ones out in the paddocks every day, working to improve their little slice of heaven. Listen to them. You might be surprised how intelligent and well informed and educated they are. They are the true caretakers of the land.

I am delighted with the new emphasis on the importance of humans in the overall concept. I have felt that human existence in the Green Wedge came secondary to all other environmental issues. Given that humans have lived in the Green Wedge prior to 1865 (long before the overlays), it is not logical to ignore the impact humans have had and will continue to have on this area. It has felt like the contribution that land owners make to improving their properties (weed control, vermin control, erosion control, fire mitigation; creating tourism, community, financial value) was not valued by previous Councils. It had felt like the landowners were the enemy of the Green Wedge. The devil is in the detail. While the vision sounds good, I have some concerns in the expansion of the vision. For example, papagraph 4. "Environmental or nature based opportunities will also be encouraged where they demonstrate social, environmental and economic benefits". What is an environmental opportunity? Is it commercial glamping in a sensitive bush area with good views? Later on there is reference to "balanced outcomes". What does this mean? Sometimes something is so important that there will not be a balanced outcome. For example tracts of land where there are many species of rare orchids, indigenous to Nillumbik, which needs protection. There may be no social or economic outcome for this, but it's vital. I support paragraph 3 which refers to maintenance and enhancement of the Green Wedge (GW). The thing that makes Nillumbik unique is the Green Wedge. It should be over-arching and all other things considered in relation to this, and provide context. Other cities and shires have communities, the arts, agriculture and tourism, but not an intact Green Wedge. In para 2 there is reference to "human activity" having shaped out landscape. There should also be reference to the indigenous community who protected the area until very recently (this is referred to in the Introduction) . para 5 refers to social and community challenges. While important, this ignores the elephant in the room which will ultimately destroy all that we cherish in Nillumbik - climate change. It's a global issue and one that must also be addressed locally (this is briefly referred to on page 10 but only in relation to human and animal health and wellbeing...the environmental impact which will be huge and affect human and animal life is not referred to)

KM1 This is moderately interesting. The problem is about "leading horses to water" . Such a service could create awareness, but this is only the first step in change. To improve land management requires a whole behaviour change strategy, including incentives (based on evidence of effectiveness), and an implementation plan. I agree re asking Government for funding. Unfortunately Nillumbik has a very small resident base and large area. Money will always be a problem (as stated on page 13) KM2 Achievement of this is going to require far more than conversations. Need more detail about the "whole of organisation approach". The words sound good but there is a serious lack of detail, indicating a lack of understanding about what will be involved. KM3 There is a typo here. It should be "GW Conservation program". Again while its is important for raising awareness, conversations are not sufficient. It's step one of ten. KM4 This is OK as community building, but I'm unclear what " a comprehensive planning and place management service" would be.

KM5 Yes, you need information, as you cannot management what you cannot measure. However, it does not go far enough. You need data but this is again step one of ten or fifty. You need a program backed by funding, with actions and an implementation plan and KPIs.

Re "assisting land owners in best practices land management" this needs more detail and dollars. Other shires and cities have programs to help land owners to improve their land in terms of its environmental quality, thru providing subsidies for fencing dams, weed control, pest control and so on. I think this is A3.5 and support its promotion and expansion.

Agree re community resilience. There is a great example in Warrandyte which has a Be Ready Warrandyte program.

Policy is a great way of protecting the environment and there needs to be more consideration given to this lever.

I am totally against any watering down of the GW boundaries.

I think it is Council's role to implement the intent of this.

Some councillors may not individually support the outcome, but they are not on Council to promote this own agenda, but to deliver what is best for the shire. It's a governance role.

There is a lack of science and evidence in the underlying assumptions of the plan. Managing the GW is a huge responsibility and I support Nillumbik in seeking additional funding for this. The GW, once lost, can never be recreated, so we are all responsible for its preservation and good management. Council should find the best environmental scientists and other experts to help.

The current council narrative and use of the term 'small block' or 'small lot' needs to be removed from any GWMP as the council was the responsible authority that allowed the subdivision of the land in history past and are now still quite happy to receive substantial rates and charges from these blocks. In the event of a bushfire damaging or destroying a house or shed on the small block council needs to enshrine in the GWMP a right to rebuild on that land in the location of the original dwelling if the landowner wants it there,

not in some other obscure location on the block or refuse the rebuilding at the whim of a planner.

Council or any other entity should not have the right to deny someone the right to rebuild their house just because they live in the green wedge on a smaller than 20acre rural block.

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A Vision for Nillumbik's Green Wedge

Our local Green Wedge is of critical importance to our shire and on a wider scale, the whole of Melbourne. It acts as the lungs of Melbourne and a place for residents and tourists to be at one with nature. The protection and reinvigoration of the environment needs to be a central part of the vision for our Green Wedge and this is not stated clearly enough in the draft. For example, saying that "Environment or nature based opportunities will also be encouraged where they demonstrate environmental, social and economic benefits" makes the environment sound like an afterthought and the lowest priority. It needs to be the first priority and we should be actively finding ways to achieve social and economic benefit from the environment, not using them as factors to decide whether we protect the environment or not. The vision seems to be at odds with the State Government's Plan Melbourne 2017-2050, which states that the first priority for Green Wedges is to "Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." After Council spent a huge amount of rate-payers' money to run a community panel to inform this plan, the result demonstrated clearly that the majority of residents in the shire love and cherish the environment in our Green Wedge. They want

Nillumbik to continue to be the Green Wedge Shire, where the Green Wedge is protected and enhanced through Council policy. The vision does not reflect this and references to "Living in the Landscape" are a clear erasure of these values. The plan needs to reflect that our Green Wedge is still the most intact of all of the Green Wedges in Melbourne and is a vital part of the wider system of Green Wedges. Its presence here is for the benefit of the whole of Melbourne, whether they live in Nillumbik or not. The plan is not strong enough on mitigation of the Climate Emergency. It is good to see that Council wants to adapt to the impacts of Climate Change but this seems to be the only focus and mitigation of the threat is forgotten. There is a lot that Council can do to mitigate Climate Change and Council must play its part. Declaring a state of Climate Emergency should be central to this and should go hand in hand with protection and enhancement of the Green Wedge. The traditional owners of our land are not mentioned enough throughout the plan despite having been the best custodians this land has ever had. They maintained the biodiversity of this area for thousands of years and we owe it to them to continue to protect that biodiversity and to recognise and celebrate their success in this area.

The five key moves could all be used well to protect the Green Wedge if they are applied correctly and to ensure that this happens, they need to have a much stronger focus on looking after the natural environment. In particular, the actions that must be taken to protect the environment must be stated in the document, with best environmental practice a priority to protect all native flora and fauna in our precious

Green Wedge. I have said in the web form that I disagree with them because there is a worrying lack of detail and lack of focus on environmental protection. 1 - Providing information to landowners can be very beneficial but it needs to be clearly stated how this will be done and what will be in the information. The information should remind landowners about their responsibilities to be good custodians of the local environment and why this is important. It should also contain advice on how to best maintain and enhance the natural environment and what landowners can and cannot do in the Green Wedge. It could also be used very beneficially in helping potential buyers practice due diligence so as they are aware of what they can and can't do before they buy land and nobody is left with a stranded asset. 2 - It is good to focus on community resilience but the description of this move is vaque and seems like a long list of buzz words with no real action. In particular, Climate Change should be a priority and Council should have a strong plan to address and mitigate this threat. 4 – This move has no mention of the environment at all. This is very worrying in a plan which should have been written with the environment in mind. The first priority of this move must be to strengthen and enhance the natural environment across the Green Wedge. I note that as part of this draft, Council has not established a Policy Steering Group with stakeholder representatives, even though this is a requirement under Note 31 of the State Government's Planning Practice policy. This is very concerning. The draft does not articulate an Implementation Plan to the kind of standard that is acceptable to this community. The strong detail in the current plan is lost in the new draft. Planning Practice Note 31 requires that Council sets out actions and measures which need to be undertaken and this is not done in the draft. Council should use the previous plan as a basis for the new plan and build on it rather than weakening it and throwing out all of the elements that make it strong. Our current Green Wedge Management plan has very strong detail on how we should ensure protection of the Green Wedge and yet we are still losing vegetation in the area. This is an indicator that the plan, while good, is not strong enough and needs to be strengthened to reverse the decline. The draft does not achieve this and in fact winds back that detail and puts local vegetation at an even greater threat.

These principles are full of buzz words with no real action or meaning. 350 words are used and nothing is actually said. Although I agree in principle with many of the principles, the lack of detail and clarity mean that I cannot agree with Council's version of them. I am concerned about the lack of clarity about how they may be interpreted and applied in caring for the environment. The principles need to reflect the commitment to protecting the environment that was shown by the community in Council's recent expensive panel consultation processes. There is no principle in the plan which has a focus on the preservation and enhancement of the environment and biodiversity or which recognises the need to urgently reverse the decline of biodiversity and Climate Change. This needs to be added to the plan and treated as a priority. I think it's good that Council recognises Aboriginal Voice in its principles but the description of this principle is vague, short and does not do justice to the thousands of years of protection and good stewardship afforded to this land by its traditional owners. Managing Change for Future Benefit recognises that the Green Wedge is constantly changing but doesn't focus enough on protecting the environment and biodiversity through future change or dealing with and mitigating the effects of Climate Change on our Green Wedge. These are both things which need to be tackled by the plan. Social Equity is something that Council should have a very strong focus on but seems out of place in a plan that is meant to address the local environment. Its presence in the draft feels like a distraction from the real issue at hand, which is the environment.

I am glad to see that Council is considering how the community can best be connected throughout the shire but this goal completely misses the point that this is a Green Wedge Management Plan. The plan should be about how the Green Wedge can best be managed to protect and enhance the local environment and to provide the best possible outcomes for the local community and the wider Melbourne. The wording of this goal is entirely about people and does not belong in a Green Wedge Management Plan. It would be very welcome in another Council document but this document is about conserving the Green Wedge, something which the Local Government Review Board declared as the strategic focus of our shire in 1994. If this goal were to be made relevant to the Green Wedge Management Plan, it would need to be reworded to express the differing needs between those living in urban areas and those living in the Green Wedge and it would need to have a plan to use community connectedness to assist and encourage people to be good custodians of the land and the natural environment. It should be about how we can protect and enhance the local environment - "What can we do for the land?", not "What can the land do for us?". It would also be worth mentioning under this goal that the whole community needs to come together to take serious action on Climate Change. If Council were to declare a Climate Emergency, this would fit in well with protection of the local environment and Council would have an opportunity to educate and work with the local community to help tackle the Climate Crisis.

Again, this is a good thing for Council to be pursuing but with the current level of detail, it does not belong in a Green Wedge Management Plan. There is not enough detail on how this relates to preserving and enhancing the local environment. As a cyclist, I'm glad to see it mentioned that the Green Wedge helps promote cycling. It does and this is

a huge benefit to our community, allowing locals to stay fit and healthy and encouraging tourists to pass through and spend money here. To ensure that we continue to reap the benefits of "active and creative people" from our Green Wedge, we need to preserve biodiversity as our top priority. The draft is right in saying that green spaces help promote health through encouraging exercise and improving mental wellbeing and social connectedness but none of the objectives or key actions talk about preserving biodiversity to achieve this. It is good that the draft aims to encourage more people to connect with the Green Wedge and learn about its value and beauty but there is no point doing this if the Green Wedge is going to be destroyed. The plan must aim to preserve and enhance biodiversity. This goal is once again about what the Green Wedge can do for us and not about what we can do for the Green Wedge. Our relationship with the Green Wedge must work both ways or we will quickly lose everything that we value about it. It is vital for the health of the whole community that we work with the Traditional Custodians of our land and have greater dialogue with them about how they loved and protected this land for thousands of years so we can continue to carry the torch on this - together. Goal 2 needs to make strong reference to this in its objectives and key actions.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? Like other goals, this goal could be meritorious if applied correctly but I cannot support it with the current detail. The opening statement sums it up well: "Healthy and safe communities enjoy living in our iconic green wedge environment". This statement alludes to the benefits of the Green Wedge and what it can do for us but makes no reference to conserving and enhancing it. If we don't have a two-way relationship with our Green Wedge, we will lose it. The plan mentions bushfires and managing the related risks to environment and human life but does not include details on how the risk can be managed while still ensuring environmental protection. The Traditional Owners of our land managed the risk of bushfires for thousands of years without harming biodiversity and this plan should aim to do the same. It needs to be clearly stated that cutting trees down has an adverse affect on bushfire prevention because it encourages undergrowth and small vegetation to flourish and this vegetation burns more easily. Large, established trees can, in fact, provide a shield against bushfires. Bushfires can be managed through sustainable management of the land with biodiversity at the centre of everything we do. The plan must focus on this and make sustainable, environmentally friendly bushfire mitigation a top priority. This part of the plan consistently mentions adapting to Climate Change but this is not enough. Council must declare a Climate Emergency and take immediate action to mitigate the threat because we will not be able to adapt quickly enough and local residents, along with the rest of the world, will suffer greatly from the impacts of Climate Change. Part of creating safe and healthy

environments is preserving and enhancing all indigenous vegetation. The plan needs to focus on doing this throughout the shire - both on public and private land. We need to take a systems view of our Green Wedge. All parts of the Green Wedge are interdependent on each other. What we do on private lots can have a profound effect on both public land and other private lots in the area. With the repeated use of the word "balance", Goal 3 creates the impression that environmental concerns require a trade off with other considerations. This is not the case at all and strong environmental protection can go hand in hand with positive social and economic advancement. The plan seems to allude to some areas of vegetation being more valuable than others. This discriminatory way of thinking will lead to further degradation of an environment which is already under pressure. Due to mismanagement of the Green Wedge, a lot of our ecosystems have been disturbed and this is a problem. By differentiating between different areas of vegetation, the plan creates the risk that small cuts to vegetation that is considered less important than other vegetation could eventually lead to the destruction of the whole Green Wedge. As I mentioned above, we need to have a systems view of this issue and acknowledge that all flora and fauna in our Green Wedge is equally valuable in ensuring the ongoing biodiversity of the land. In creating safe and healthy environments, it is important to educate the public about the importance and value of the environment and how to help protect and enhance it. This goal needs an additional action to run a massive public education campaign to help the public learn about biodiversity, the value and fragility of ecosystems, how to enjoy and preserve natural landscapes, how to manage bushfire risk sustainably, Climate Change and the significance of our Green Wedge.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4?

Council does need to have a focus on the local economy and the Green Wedge can be a big part of this but I do not agree with this goal because there is a worrying lack of detail about how the Green Wedge will be protected while forming a central part of our Shire's economy. Again, we need a two way relationship with the Green Wedge – what can we do for the Green Wedge; not just what can the Green Wedge do for us. Economic activities must be constantly re-evaluated to keep up to date with the latest science to ensure that the environment is always protected and enhanced. The draft plan states that a major part of Nillumbik's economy is its proximity to Melbourne City. I agree with this but the plan needs to state much more clearly that the Green Wedge is a huge part of why our proximity to Melbourne helps us. The Green Wedge encourages tourism and as the most pristine of all of Melbourne's Green Wedges, it has the opportunity to be a very popular tourist attraction for our Shire. This opportunity is largely untapped and the plan needs to find ways of taking full advantage of the opportunity and also needs to acknowledge that it is only the strong biodiversity of our Green Wedge

that makes this opportunity viable. We must preserve and enhance biodiversity in the Green Wedge to retain the edge we currently have over other shires and we must link tourism in with educating the wider Melbourne community about the importance and the benefits of the Green Wedge, the challenges it faces and how we can all come together to protect it. The plan has a focus on internet and mobile access and refers to the impact of poor connectivity on businesses. There is also an impact on residents and this should be noted in the plan. There is no question that connectivity must be improved across our shire, namely in the Green Wedge. Not only will this help improve our economy but it will create an important network of communication in the case of an emergency such as a bushfire. With new technologies arriving such as the rollout of the NBN and the eventual rollout of 5G, Council has the opportunity to work with telco providers and the local community to improve connectivity and to ensure that new network infrastructure is appropriate in terms of environmental sustainability and local character. New network infrastructure must not threaten biodiversity and it must not create an eyesore for local residents and tourists. Under Objectives 4.3 and 4.4, the plan recognises and plans to support the contribution of hobby farmers and the equine community. I find it strange that the equine community is mentioned specifically here. This very narrow objective seems to focus on a very small minority of our community without acknowledging the contribution of others. There are horse riders on Council and it seems that they have inserted this into the plan for their own means, without considering the wider community and this is troubling. Furthermore, Objectives 4.3 and 4.4 need to have a bigger focus on how hobby farmers and members of the equine community can be better custodians of our land. It is not enough to acknowledge their contribution. We must be constantly striving for improvement and there needs to be a solid plan to help hobby farmers and people in the equine community to improve their knowledge and understanding of the importance of the Green Wedge and how they can better contribute to preserving and enhancing local biodiversity. Namely, we must promote regenerative farming and water conservation and tie this in with indigenous knowledge. Sustainable agriculture is strongly linked to climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge and the plan needs to recognise this. Under the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, when preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan, a framework is needed to encourage sustainable land management practices. This is not present in the current draft, even under this goal, which talks a lot about agriculture and the use of the land. The plan suggests that residents shouldn't need a permit to farm in the Rural Conservation Zone if the land has already been cleared. There needs to be more detail here. A lot of Nillumbik has been cleared at some point but the land regrows and can remain environmentally significant. Permits need to be used to ensure that the environmental significance of the land is respected and that residents are made aware in advance if someone plans to start farming next door. Animals with hard hoofs, such as horses, are not native to Australia and our environment has not evolved to cope with them. Their presence here, if not managed properly, can cause erosion, threaten water quality, damage flora and fauna and cause weeds to spread. The plan mentions agriculture and equine presence but does not have a method of limiting the impact that hard-hoofed animals have on our Green Wedge. Actions must be taken including preventing animals with hard hoofs from entering waterways and grazing in the bush. I am glad to see that

the plan discourages the further fragmentation of rural properties. I would like to see this point made stronger. Until recently, the planning scheme had a clause which made it very difficult to subdivide small lots and the plan should look into reinstating and strengthening this clause. Cycle tourism is a very important part of our economy and it is good that the plan recognises this. It would be beneficial for the plan to have a focus on making the area safer for cyclists. The difference between the issues faced by road riders and trail riders needs to be acknowledged. Road riders face danger from cars and this can be improved by creating better signage to remind drivers that there are riders around and by creating and improving bike lanes where this can be done without having a negative impact on local flora and fauna. For trail riders, there needs to be a focus on making trails safer by improving the surface and by creating a better structure to allow cyclists and pedestrians to share the trail. The current situation puts both riders and pedestrians at risk because they are not reminded to pay attention to each other. The plan should also focus on creating and advertising natural attractions to draw cyclists in. Cyclists love to see biodiversity and natural wonders around them as they roll around and the plan should focus on enhancing this within our Green Wedge.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? Again, I cannot support this goal due to the lack of detail about how it relates to the Green Wedge. None of the objectives or actions relate to protecting the Green Wedge or protecting and enhancing biodiversity. There is also worrying vagueness, for example, Action 5.2, which proposes a whole or organisation approach to certain specific things and a "range of other matters". This vagueness leaves the plan open to interpretation which will cause confusion and prevent it from achieving its purpose of protecting the Green Wedge. The very few parts of this goal which do mention the Green Wedge have a focus on sharing and building knowledge. For example, creating community education and discussion programs and doing stock takes. It is important to build knowledge and it is important to share knowledge but the plan doesn't suggest any action to come from this. What will we do with the knowledge once we have it? Will we harness it to protect and enhance biodiversity or will it be wasted? Without strong action points, it will be the latter. Actions 5.6 and 5.7 are very concerning. They threaten to whittle away at our Green Wedge and further increase urban sprawl within the area. The Urban Growth Boundary should be treated as a hard boundary. It does not move and it is not lenient. One metre across the boundary is still across the boundary and outside the Urban Growth Boundary, the priority is to preserve vegetation and biodiversity. The draft plan would put the boundary under pressure, which beats the purpose of having it in the first place. There are some worrying open statements under this goal, namely Actions 5.7 and 5.8. It is not enough to say "better manage rural land that abuts the Urban Growth Boundary"; we actually need to define what better management is. Likewise, it is not

enough to say we'll "advocate Council's position" to government. We actually need a statement about what that position is and what our core values are. Both of these actions need to come back to a key value of environmental protection - protecting the Green Wedge, protecting local flora and fauna, revegetating and preserving and enhancing biodiversity. The draft plan mentions stewardship of the land but this needs to be referred to and expanded on under this goal, which it currently is not. All residents of this shire have an obligation to care for the land and protect, not degrade it. The land and its many ecosystems and waterways must be passed on in a better state than when we got them. Council should be educating the community about this and leading the way on revegetating and preserving and enhancing biodiversity. Single trees in large paddocks and small areas of remnant bush are environmentally significant. All green areas in our shire are currently under threat and this plan needs to give them more care and protection, not less. It is concerning that the plan wants to dial back on Rural Conservation Zones, suggesting they're restrictive on farming practices. Farming can co-exist with conservation and many farmers take stewardship of the land very seriously. Farmers want to work sustainably and protect the environment but this plan seems to misrepresent them. Rural Conservation Zones are crucial in Nillumbik, the Green Wedge Shire. The community wants them to stay and many farmers do too. Council can do a lot of things to support farmers and rezoning Rural Conservation Zones is not one of them. Part of responsible leadership is responding to and dealing with threats to people and the environment. The Climate Emergency is a big issue right now and this goal needs an action to tackle it. Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 speaks of the need to "Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." Council has a responsibility to do this through not only educating residents but also enforcing policy to ensure that this is achieved and allocating appropriate resources to the issue. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report points to inadequate enforcement as a contributing factor to the shire's loss of vegetation and the plan should deal with this.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

The single strongest message from the community panel when council did their first consultation on this issue was that the whole of Nillumbik and wider Melbourne love the environment and biodiversity of the Nillumbik Green Wedge and want it to be protected, maintained, enhanced and reinvigorated. The draft almost completely ignores this and goes off in a wildly different direction. This is undemocratic and makes the expensive consultation process useless. Nillumbik Council was established with the purpose of being the Green Wedge Shire. Nillumbik Council's role is to have a strategic focus on maintaining and enhancing the Green Wedge. The plan fails to reaffirm this. There is nowhere near enough detail to sufficiently protect the local environment and the objectives, actions, goals and accountability measures are completely lacking in their

ability to promote the health and the purpose of the Green Wedge in the long term. According to the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services, "the health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever." The existence of Green Wedges is crucial in preventing and reversing this trend and Nillumbik Council has the power to make a huge difference and save these ecosystems for the good of locals, humanity and the whole world. If only there was the political will. The draft does not sufficiently address the impact of invasive flora and fauna on the Green Wedge. Council should use this plan to lead the way on eradicating weeds and finding humane and non-lethal ways of controlling feral species. This can be achieved through mechanisms such as trap, spay, neuter, release schemes, relocation of pests, barriers to keep pests out of sensitive areas and more innovative solutions such as the PZP vaccine, which can be used to vaccinate deer against pregnancy. I have grave concerns with this plan. It has the potential to do irreparable damage to the area that we love. As a review, this process should build upon the existing Green Wedge Management Plan but instead, Council has all but erased it and replaced it with a much vaguer, weaker plan, which will not sufficiently protect the local environment and which does not represent the clear message that residents sent to council through the community panel consultation process. The plan puts people's greed first and fails to acknowledge that the environment is important for all of us. The plan must acknowledge that environmental protection can go hand-in-hand with what is good for people. There must be a two-way relationship between us and the environment. We must give back what we take out or the environment will suffer and so will we. It is my opinion that this draft plan misses the mark on a wide range of issues. It is written in a fashion which prevents it from being effective in achieving the fundamental goals of Green Wedges. It needs to undergo substantial change to the extent of a full rewrite if it is to achieve what a Green Wedge Management Plan should achieve. If Council is not prepared to make substantial changes to the draft as I have outlined in my submission, I ask that this draft is dumped and we continue to use the current Green Wedge Management Plan, which is valid until 2025 and which, while still not fully adequate, meets the requirements of a Green Wedge Management Plan to a much greater extent than this draft.

The principles are very broad and lack specific detail as to how they relate to the environment. They are basically a list of platitudes that are open to interpretation. The principle relating to aboriginal voice is laughable in its vagueness. What? How Why? are the fundamental questions that need to be applied to each principle. These are fundamentally lacking and therefore give the draft plan no teeth.

There is no mention of maintaining and promoting biodiversity.

The wording needs to be much for specific than "Change will be managed to conserve its values and with a focus on long term stewardship". In reality what does this mean? It is far too broad- and is therefore open to interpretation.

While I commend community engagement, the point needs to be more forcefully made that the Shire of Nillumbik was set up in 1994 to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. As the shire comes under increasing pressure from developers, this point must not be lost.

Community engagement to mitigate, not just manage the effects of climate change, and emission reductions, is of vital importance.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4? A lack of detail is a concern. The draft plan does not demonstrate a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices as outlined in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, as is required.

I am especially concerned about the mention of farming in RCZ areas not requiring a permit if the land has been previously cleared for farming. This definition of cleared land would appear to be far too broad. Permits should always be required as a check on inappropriate use of the land which could severely impact on both the environment and the amenity of neighbours.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5?

Of real concern is key Action A5.6 and A5.7 of the draft which proposes changes to land use in the Green Wedge. This could lead to residential and commercial development beyond the Urban Growth Boundary and lead to a destruction of the value of the Green Wedge. This is entirely unacceptable. The urban Growth Boundary must remain fixed.

The suggestion of lessening the restrictions on farming in Rural Conservation Zones is a retrograde step and will lead, little by little to the diminution of the Green Wedge.

Responsible Leadership should include a section dealing with climate change mitigation. This and inappropriate developments are the two biggest threats to the Green Wedge.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

It is vital that the GWMP reaffirms the Shire's conservation role with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. I cannot support the draft GWMP because it consistently fails to do this. It lacks detail, omits significant objectives and relevant actions.

The residents have made their position clear throughout 2018, in community consultations and the Panel Report, that they value the Green Wedge and want it enhanced, not diminished. The gall of this Council in continuing to ignore the stated wishes of the residents is breathtaking.

SUBMISSION ABOUT THE DRAFT GREEN WEDGE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Liezl Shnookal 4/08/2019

No. Our Green Wedge Shire does not deserve this Green Wedge Management Plan. Nillumbik's residents do not deserve this plan. And I, a proactive landholder of acreage and proud ratepayer of many years within Nillumbik, do not deserve this plan. No.

For this Plan does not safeguard the integrity of our Green Wedge; neither does it provide a solid plan for its protection.

This is of little surprise. For one of the Plan's key drivers is Nillumbik's Mayor, Cr Karen Egan. Cr Egan does not appear to have a good understanding of the history of Nillumbik's Green Wedge or in fact, about Green Wedges in general. Only a year ago (1/8/2018) Cr Egan posted this on the Friends of Nillumbik's facebook page:

"I'm so over history being rewritten about the Green Wedge. It was started in the 70's by 3 farmers to stop large land holdings from being broken up and sold off. Eric Butler was one of them. Another from Strathewen and one from Kangaroo Ground. Later on, other green wedges were set up BUT NOT as insurance against urban sprawl. That is a myth that some like to perpetuate."

Cr Egan has since deleted her post but screenshots are still available.

To correct Cr Egan, and to remind Liberal party member Cr Clarke, it was the farsighted Liberal premier, Sir Rupert Hamer, who initiated the concept of Green Wedges. In 1971 there was initial recognition of green wedge areas within Melbourne metropolitan planning documents (Planning Policies for the Melbourne Metropolitan Region (1971) Report). In 2003 Green Wedges were enshrined in legislation (*Planning and Environment (Metropolitan Green Wedge Protection) Act* 2003) and in Victorian Planning Provisions. The Urban Growth Boundary was designed, in part, to protect the integrity of the green wedges.

Population increase and dramatic escalation of land prices over the past two decades have resulted in people moving further out of the city. Significant new developments have occurred on the fringes of the existing Green Wedges. As a result, there has been pressure to change the planning conditions currently protecting Green Wedges. This pressure has inevitably come from developers and individuals who stand to make windfall gains from rezoning.

The concept of Green Wedge refers to non-urban areas surrounding Melbourne that contain a mix of agriculture and low-density activities. About one third of the total green wedge area is public land, including national parks, other parks, reserves, and closed protected water catchments.

Green Wedges are environmentally significant areas and have enormous value as such. They have long been described as the lungs of Melbourne. With their wide open spaces, they provide an escape from the more confined spaces of the suburbs, both inner and outer, enabling a different form of relaxation and opportunities for recreational pursuits not available in built up areas. In this regard, suburban and green wedge areas complement each other. Green Wedges also preserve a high degree of bio-diversity in a way not possible in built up areas. Victoria has experienced extensive biodiversity loss over the past two centuries due to land clearing, pests, land development, water pollution and climate change, making the retaining of the integrity of our Green Wedges even more paramount.

Green Wedges also function as carbon sinks and are vital in storing carbon that would be otherwise released into the atmosphere. This is especially important at a time when carbon is increasing to dangerous levels and warming the planet. Built up areas can be regarded as "heating up" spaces, whereas open land is a "cooling down" space.

Green Wedges also constitute our food bowl and includes highly productive agricultural land producing up to 41% of Melbourne's food needs.

As economic entities, the Green Wedges contain small farms and orchards, tourist attractions and other various small businesses. However, the rationale for their existence has never been primarily an economic one.

Green Wedges are instruments that provide for the health and wellbeing of communities, for stimulating the imagination, and demonstrating how economic use of the land can be combined with its aesthetic and recreational use.

There are many of us who love our particular Green Wedge. The Nillumbik Green Wedge Management Plan Community Engagement Report prepared by Wayfarer Consulting and published in August 2018, found that people enjoy the space and the sense of peace and wellbeing that comes from living on a Green Wedge. They also appreciate the environment, biodiversity, plants and animals that are sustained in Green Wedge environments. Further, many responses emphasised the need to maintain the protection of the Green Wedge, adding such warnings as "don't mess it up"!

Yet here we have a Council which is trying to do exactly that: - "mess it up". For this plan proposes to:

- Rezone farmland from RCZ to Green Wedge Zone, so the protection of biodiversity values is not required. This will also allow commercial ventures such as pig farming back into the area which would be an enormous travesity for this area. (I clearly remember the stench coming from the effluent of a nearby intensive piggery when I lived in Kangaroo Ground and the piggery trucks constantly squeezing through Hurstbridge's township.)
- Allow for more development on rural land next to the Urban Growth Boundary and around township boundaries.
- Only protect pockets of 'valuable' biodiversity in the Green Wedge, but not where there's farming activity.

Also the Plan will not:

- Confront general biodiversity and habitat loss across our Green Wedge.
- Protect remnant native vegetation to help mitigate climate change or restore wildlife corridors to help species survive.
- Ensure sustainable land management.
- Protect Green Wedge landscape values or reduce development pressure in our Green Wedge.

As the St Andrews Landcare representative, I was part of the initial committee which helped shape the Green Wedge Management Plan that was adopted in 2010. Unlike our current Mayor and many of Nillumbik's current sitting Councillors, Nillumbik Council at that time had a solid knowledge base and understanding of the value of our Green Wedge and were committed to its protection. Councillors ensured that the process of developing that Green Wedge Management Plan was thorough, and included extensive consultation with the Nillumbik community and with local experts in the field. Assistance too was provided by long-term staff members and managers at Council who had built up strong expertise and knowledge in this area, yet these people have mainly all gone now and have not had a hand in the current process. The years of collaborative input and hard work resulted in a comprehensive and strategic Green Wedge Management Plan 2010 – 2025. It did not need to be reviewed only eight years after its implementation, and I strongly recommend that this Plan is reinstated.

Unlike its predecessor, Nillumbik cannot be proud of this current draft Green Wedge Management Plan. I strongly oppose its adoption, because it does not provide adequate environmental protection for Nillumbik's Green Wedge. I remind Council that it is of paramount importance that we preserve the integrity of our Green Wedge for our own generation, and for those who come after us. We need a Green Wedge Management Plan which will do this; this one does not.

(a) I like the phrase "will lead the way", but the main motherhood statement seems to miss the point of what green wedges are for. We need to "lead the way" in environmental protection and reinvigoration. We do seem already to "lead the way" in that Nillumbik's green wedge has kept to that identity better than others in Melbourne, but we need to maintain that example. We also need that opening paragraph to reflect what Plan Melbourne 2017-2015 tells us is our top priority. For example: "Management of the Nillumbik green wedge will lead the way in maintaining and enhancing the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species whilst at the same time supporting a vibrant, resilient, connected and diverse community." (b) "Continued application of the urban growth boundary" doesn't show enough spine. It sounds like the Council just has to apply it wherever happens to be. We need Council to be really clear that the boundary is be immutable, it is to stay where it is. The paragraph about rural townships also needs a clear statement that they are not to encroach on surrounding landscapes. I'm all for them being the "primary focus for local economic activity in the green wedge" and I support "sensitive" moves to give them "economic vitality" but a clear statement needs to be made that they will not actually grow outwards. (c) Why is

climate change mitigation not mentioned in the Vision? This is the biggest issue of our time and it must inform all objectives and actions PLEASE. And I don't mean "coping with it". I use the word mitigation intentionally, because now is the hour when there are things we can, and must, do.

I see that double-speak for bringing the more unwilling members of the community on board, but that's covered already, sort of, in key move #3? (b) If the 5 Key Moves are meant to be an introduction to an Implementation Plan, there needs to be a proper interconnection between them and the Objectives and Key Actions that follow. Some of what's here is reflected there, but not consistently. I'd also expect to see Timelines, and other details like required Outcomes and Evaluations. (c) Could an improved version please say something about biodiversity or about reversing the current trend we have which is a net loss of vegetation generally.

(a) Aboriginal voice — it sounds good to put this here, but I don't see any follow-up conversations being suggested, just that literature already written be taken notice of, so this one looks like just a bit of lip-service. (b) Relationship to Metropolitan Melbourne — there is phrasing here that really worries me. First, I would prefer something like "Nillumbik's importance to Metropolitan Melbourne and to generations both present and future" But second, the paragraph that follows is somewhat sanctimonious? self-righteous? spoilt brat-like? I interpret it to mean "Sorry guys but we are a bit stuck with rules we have no control over. Basically we are forced to live uncomfortably so that others can be happier than we'll ever be — but hopefully we can make a few sub-rules that benefit ourselves in all this." We are custodians of this area and yes, other people benefit from our looking after it well but we will too, and so will the generations that follow us if we do a good enough job of it. PLEASE rework this one. (c) Please also add a principle about the preservation of the environment and biodiversity. We need to do

something about the loss of vegetation and decline in biodiversity. Something about climate change mitigation could be part of this principle also.

water flows ..." . In fact we need to PRIORITISE the environmental considerations or in the long run we all suffer. (c) Please add an Action to promote advocacy with the state government to re-think the 10/30, 10/50, and fence-line rules for bushfire protection when it comes to towns and built up areas. (d) And please add an Action for a public education campaign. There's a lot that could go on the agenda, about which we all need to become wiser, for example - biodiversity - value of ecosystems - bushfire risk reduction (and the ancient role of fire?) - why the green wedge is so important - climate change mitigation - caring for our natural landscape

(a) Please add a map that shows the zonings across the shire – RCZ, GWZ, etc. There are so many maps already that not having this one is a strange exclusion, and it's not easy to find online. (b) I do NOT support the re-zoning of farmland from RCZ to GWZ, and I believe the second last paragraph on page 40 gives a false impression. From this government website: http://agriculture.vic.gov.au/agriculture/farmmanagement/business-management/planning-applications-in-rural-areas/rural-zones-explained ... I understand that RCZ is the main zone for rural areas of environmental significance. That applies to Nillumbik's green wedge area. It goes on to say that "Agriculture is allowed in the RCZ provided it is consistent with the environmental and

landscape values of the area. Agriculture (other than animal keeping, apiculture, intensive animal husbandry and timber production) and a single dwelling require approval in the RCZ, whereas animal boarding and intensive animal husbandry are prohibited." I support all of this for our green wedge. A landholder having to apply for a permit is not the same as not being able to get one. Maybe they don't want to have to apply, but the process helps ensure that the green wedge will be looked after. I think it is important that the status quo is maintained. We have had a net loss of vegetation already. Permits need to be enforced more, not less.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

(a) Somehow completely missing is a statement summarising the purpose of green wedges. I fear it has been forgotten (except in terms of "the state government is making us do x and y"). The environmental and biodiversity aspects have thereby disappeared, and the need to maintain these areas as un-developed as possible. I acknowledge that landowners in Nillumbik may have been feeling undervalued, but if so, that's a pity. But I'm left with a worry about how un-firm the UGB is going to be, about the potential for expansion of townships within the green wedge. I fear that Council is becoming seduced by the vision of the tourism dollar and forgetting what the green wedge is for. (b) Oh, and did I mention climate change mitigation? Six times? Well let's make it seven. I don't mean bushfires. I'm not talking about adaptation either. You've covered both of those fine. I mean positive actions that will mitigate climate change, draw down our carbon emissions. Climate change mitigation. Now. While we still can. Climate change mitigation? Yep, that's the one. Thanks.

There needs to be much greater emphasis on the care of the natural environment, especially actions to ensure the protection of ALL native flora and fauna. Whilst the current GWMP 2010-2025 has much greater detail than the draft document - and should thus be used as a basis for improvement - it still needs to be much stronger and clearer, as there has so far been consistent vegetation loss. This vegetation loss must be stopped/reversed.

Preservation of environment and viodiversity must be included as a principle. Principles need to reflect the community's commitment to protecting the Green Wedge, the decline of native plants and animals, and improving the natural environment in line with state government policies, e.g. Plan Melbourne 2017-2050. Principles contain potentially useful ideas but there must be greater emphasis on protecting the environment.

Lacks details Engaging the community is important but must be framed in the context of environmental protection. The Shire was set up to be a Conversation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. "How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?" must be the focus rather than "What can we get ouf of the land?" The latter question sounds like 'mining the land' rather than cultivating it. Working together to mitigate climate change is vital. Green Wedge areas have different needs to normal rural

land - this must be made clear.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2? Lack of detail Green space is vital to health. The Shire's biodiversity is an important feature here and must be given high priority. Dialogue with traditional custodians is important.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? Lack of detail The importance f conserving all indigenous vegetation, both on public and private land, must be stressed. "Balance" is used widely, but if environmental values are not uppermost then other activities will inevitably suffer in the long term. Bit-by-bit land clearing and grazing leaves plants and animals vulnerable to ever increasing stress and disappearance. Most land is already under severe stress and must not be allowed to degrade further. On the contrarty: it needs re-generation. An extensive public education campaign regarding biodiversity, ecosystems, bushfire reduction strategies climate change et al, and their interdependence, must be included here.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4? Lack of detail Overall environmental protection must be the clear focus. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protection. Goal 4 should be renamed "A prosperous Green Wedge economy". Whilst support for local agriculture is important, the obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge must be central to the GWMP. This draft does not clearly outline how sustainable land management practices will be encouraged as is required by State Planning. This draft suggests that no permit would be required to start farming in the Rural Conversation Zone if the land has been previously cleared and farmed.

Terminology is unclear. Permits MUST be required. The draft must state that tourism developments must be in conjunction with agricultural uses. This is stated in the Planning Scheme and is necessary to lessen the likelihood for inappropriate development. Horses and other hoofed animals have a strong negative effect on the environment. Actions, including education of those involved with those animals must be implemented.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5?

Responsible stewardship requires that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents and lead the way. This draft suggests that the Rural Conservation Zone be re-defined to only cover areas of higher conservation values putting at risk scattered pockets of remnant bush or sole trees which are actually in greater need of protection. Climate change mitigation to be included. Council must provide education on a range of sustainable, environmentally friendly living practices. It is Council's role to significantly contribute to educating residents regarding the protection and care of biodiversity and to provide the resources to enforce policy standards. The draft proposes changes to land users in the GW which could erode the values of the GW and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. the UGB must remain as a hard line. The draft must recognize the role Nillumbik can play locally in attacking global problems.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

In summary I want to say this: The strongest message from the initial community consultation and the panel report was that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the GW and want it to be maintained, protected and re-invigorated. This message must lay the foundation for any GWMP. This draft clearly does not meet that goal. The GWMP must reaffirm the Shire's Conservation role with the GW as its strategic focus. This draft consistently fails to do this. It lacks significant detail and omits significant objectives, relevant actions and accountability measures that woule ensure the long term health and purpose of the GW. There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included to ensure the long-term health of the GW. Invasisve

species of both fauna and floral must be better addressed. It is imperative that discussion be backed by current science, particularly with regard to the need for environmental repair and preservation and urgent climate change mitigation. And finally: It is necessary that we uphold the highest of professional standards throughout the Shire and its Leadership.

Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, while international, national, and state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment. For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained. An additional Action must be to undertake a massive public education campaign about biodiversity, the value of ecosystems, care for natural landscapes, bushfire risk reduction through understanding the ancient role of fire in the landscape, the significance of the Green Wedge, climate

change and their interdependence.

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4?

This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'. • Support for local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming including water conservation, Indigenous knowledge, and indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged. The obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge, must be central to the GWMP.

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? Stewardship of the land is mentioned in the draft plan, and its role must be better defined in Goal 5, Responsible Leadership. It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents about these matters, and lead the way by increasing revegetation of indigenous flora throughout the Shire. • This draft plan suggests the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices and this zoning should only be applied to land with higher conservation values. This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less. • Responsible Leadership should have a section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle. • Council ought to provide education and free, easily accessible advice to residents on a range of topics such as 'avoid - reduce - reuse - recycle', reducing meat-consumption, buying local produce and growing your own, responsible waste disposal, reduction of car-dependence, benefits of native vegetation etc. • This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP - Plan Melbourne 2017-2050). It is Council's responsibility to make significant contributions to the education of residents for the protection and care of biodiversity. Alongside education, it is essential that appropriate resources are allocated to the enforcement of policy standards. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report outlines the ongoing loss of native vegetation and part of the problem is inadequate enforcement. The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role that Nillumbik can play; that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

They seem to be full of fine-sounding words and 'motherhood statements', but considerably lacking in detail. Has the Council followed the State Government's policy requirements in the production of this draft GWMP? It appears not, since it does not articulate an implementation plan based on clearly stated objectives and actions together with specifying the Council Department responsible for implementing each action. The State Government's Planning Practice Note 31 states, 'Each GWMP will set out a series of actions and measures that need to be undertaken, and identify resource requirements, roles and responsibilities, timelines, outcomes and evaluation.' This draft GWMP is lacking in the detail contained in the current GWMP which it seeks to replace. The draft GWMP needs to be much stronger, giving much greater detail about ways the Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge, which is consistently losing vegetation, and hence exacerbating the effects of climate change.

that the Green Wedge has particular needs that are different from those of adjoining areas. And the community as a whole, together with Council, needs to come together to ensure serious action is taken to itigate climate change.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2? It is important to put a strong focus on protecting Nillumbik's biodiversity. More detail is needed here. Green space is a vital contributor to health and well-being of the community. And communication with traditional custodians of this area is vital for our health and the area's health.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? All indigenous vegetation in the Shire should be conserved on private and public land. Judging some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others could lead to suggestions that it be stripped of its vegetation and used commercially, thus further degrading the environment. All need to cooperate to increase habitat for wildlife, so our Mayor does not need to feature in the daily news because our wildlife has lost so much habitat the animals are encroaching on private land. "Balance" implies trading environmental health for more commercial or recreational opportunities. Without health, wealth is valueless. The Council should initiate mass public education in our Shire about the value of biodiversity, ecosystems, care for natural landscapes and bushfire prevention.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4? It would be much better if this goal were headed "A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy, where the commercial activities proposed would be assessed and altered in response to the latest science re environmental protection. Support for such activities should always be accompanied by actions to provide for the continuing health

and biodiversity of the area. Regenerative farming practices should be encouraged thus providing one means to mitigate climate change. The State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, entitled 'Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan', requires a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices. This has to be clearly demonstrated in any GWMP. This current draft does not achieve this requirement. What exactly is meant by 'cleared land'? Land that was once cleared but is in the process of regeneration, should not be treated in the same way as land that has been continuously maintained free of vegetation. Permits to commence farming are an important safeguard. And agricultural use of the Shire's land should always be in conjunction with tourism development for the area, since so much tourism is linked to, if not founded on, the 'green' nature of the Shire's environment. Appropriate and responsible ownership of hard-hoofed animals in the Shire needs to be taught and maintained, for the sake of waterways and environmental care.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? The draft GWMP does mention stewardship of the land, but this needs to be better defined under this goal. All Nillumbik residents are responsible for caring for the land not degrading it - for the whole of their tenure here. The suggestion that the Rural Conservation Zone should be less restrictive of farming practices, will put at risk flora and fauna across a significant area of the Shire. Even single trees in a paddock and isolated pockets of shrubs contribute towards mitigating climate change. On the whole this goal needs to put greater emphasis on maintaining and enhancing biodiversity, and achieving a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation. As well, sufficient resources should be allocated to enforcing policy standards. This has been inadequate, resulting in ongoing loss of native vegetation. Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary. The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role that Nillumbik can play; that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

We moved into Nillumbik nearly fifteen years ago because we were attracted to its 'green' character. As we have lived here, contributing as we are able to the life of the local community, we have come to value this quality more and more. Nillumbik has a wonderful opportunity in the GWMP to set the tone for other shires and communities, reaffirming our conservation role with the Green Wedge as its Strategic Focus. As biodiversity decreases, and climate change increases, there is urgent need to stem this tide before it is too late. The Draft GWMP needs more detail and clearly defined actions to address the problems of the long-term health of the Green Wedge.

This did not occur.
- •This draft fails to clearly articulate an Implementation Plan based on clearly stated Objectives and Actions and the Council Department responsible for implementation. As stated in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, 'Each GWMP will set out aseries of actions and measures that need to be undertaken, and identify resource requirements, roles and responsibilities, timelines, outcomes and evaluation.'The current GWMP has much greater detail than this new draft, and should be used as a basis forimprovement. What is presented in the Vision section reads as hollow rhetoric, it lacks detail and fails to identify the actual practices and processes the Council intends to utilise. This is not good enough. Where is the discussion of climate change? Why is there no modelling to show how the green wedge is likely to be impacted by climate change? This is a concerning oversight and suggests the draft plan has been poorly conceived.

This seems to be an attempt to duplicate or modify what currently exists. It's unnecessary and as the first Key Move it gives the impression of a Council lacking inspiration. KM2: The natural environment needs greater protections, it's a key reason for living in Nillumbik, this KM seems to undermine it. Residents could be educated about the planning regulations associated with living in the shire and how they may impact and place limitations on their decisions. KM3: Nice idea, however if it appears forced it will be perceived as insincere and suffer as a result. Perhaps link to education as discussed above. KM 4: The townships have sufficient and distinct identities, this KM doesn't sound necessary. Rather, it comes across as somebody deciding a marketing project would be a great idea, when part of the charm and character associated with our townships is that they are (and are full of) nicely kept secrets. This KM would jeopardise that. KM5: The Council would be far better served to make a major push to get behind Landcare, CFA, sports clubs and other other community based organisations that are the beating heart of the shire. A hobby farm inventory is unlikely to persuade or convince State govt for a funding investment in the shire. Environmental assets should be known and it's surprising to read that this is not the case.

The Council could have a central role in this. Provision of education and appropriate services and fostering the values held by the community.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2? More detail is required, trails need to be sympathetic to natural environments. Asphalt kept to a minimum. One concern I have is the lack of integration in planning around Hurstbridge. This should be fairly simple, but the council is doing a poor job of it. Perhaps the Council should demonstrate to the community that it can carry out integrated planning and delivery of projects around Hurstbridge prior to embarking on such an ambitious plan like this. Back to basics please.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

There needs to be far more detail in this, for example, supporting Melb Water and the CMA, what does this entail? Are septic tanks going to be removed in target areas? Are take and use licences going to be reviewed? What exactly can the council do regarding the identified improvements to hydrological systems? It's done very little in recent times. The environment in the GW is under constant pressure from development and is being gradually eroded. Greater protections are critical, biodiversity needs to be enhanced, not diminished.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4? More attention to environmental protections are required. I mentioned earlier that attempts to market the shire and townships are misdirected: marketing leads to development pressure, and that can spoil characteristics of the shire that residents love.

The long-term sustainable management of the GW is the critical element and is meant to be the central focus of the GWMPs. I feel the draft plan fails in this aspect. The plan must articulate how environmental qualities will be managed, facilitated and implemented. It needs to identify who is responsible for what actions, there are many agencies with responsibility in the GW, roles and responsibilities need to be defined and articulated. Has the purpose of the GW been defined? I don't believe this has been identified, yet this is important because key values can then be negotiated with the community, as can the actions that will enable the community and Council to protect and enhance these agreed values. Given the centrality of conservation within the GW, it would be useful if there was a method presented which could be used to better understand abstract ideas, such as the purpose of the GW and the values of the GW. A useful means of analysis is presented here: In his writings on the need for a land ethic Aldo Leopold presented a simple process for analysis, suggesting to "examine each question in terms of what is ethically and aesthetically right, as well as what is economically expedient. A thing is right when it tends to preserve the integrity, stability and beauty of the biotic community. It is wrong when it tends otherwise" (Leopold, A. 1949 pp 224-225). My recommendation would be to work through the draft plan and apply this to each section whilst also identifying roles and responsibilities.

It appears that Council has failed to follow State Government policy requirements in the preparation of the GWMP. This throws into question the entire document and associated processes. Planning Practice Note 31 describes specific requirements for the development of a GWMP, including the establishment of a Project Steering Group chaired by Council with key stakeholder representatives. This did not occur.

• This draft fails to clearly articulate an Implementation Plan based on clearly stated Objectives and Actions and the Council Department responsible for implementation. As stated in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, 'Each GWMP will set out a series of actions and measures that need to be undertaken, and identify resource requirements, roles and responsibilities, timelines, outcomes and evaluation.' The current GWMP has much greater detail than this new draft, and should be used as a basis for improvement. Click here for Planning Practice Note 31.

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Each of the 'Five Key Moves' contain potentially useful ideas depending on how they are applied, and

there needs to be much greater emphasis on the care of the natural environment.

The document needs to describe in much greater detail the ACTIONS to be taken, and each of these

must prioritise best environmental practice, ensuring the protection of ALL native vegetation and fauna across

the Shire.

Every descriptor needs to clearly indicate how it will contribute to the protection and reinvigoration of

biodiversity for the long term.

The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the ways Council

and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of

vegetation. This demonstrates that any new plan must be stronger and clearer about the actions which will be

taken to reverse this ongoing decline. The draft GWMP does not achieve this.

Each Principle is a very broad statement and it is unclear how they will be interpreted and applied

while ensuring care for the environment.

The Principles need to reflect the community's commitment to protecting the Green Wedge. The

GWMP must describe how the values of the Green Wedge will be prioritised in keeping

with the State

Government's policies Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 and Protecting Victoria's Environment – Biodiversity 2037,

which is 'Victoria's plan to stop the decline of our native plants and animals and improve our natural

environment so it is healthy, valued and actively cared for.'

An additional Principle that focuses on Preservation of Environment and Biodiversity, and describes

the urgent need to reverse the decline of biodiversity and effects of climate change should be added to the

GWMP. Biodiversity Protection should be given the status of a Goal in the Plan.

As with the 'Five Key Moves', the outlined Principles contain potentially useful ideas but there needs

to be greater emphasis on the protection of the environment. For example, the principle that says, 'The green

wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its values

and with a focus on long-term stewardship.' could read, "The green wedge is a changing environment and

home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its biodiversity and environmental values and

with a focus on long-term stewardship."

Goal 1: Engaged connected communities

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 1? Do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 1?

- The thrust of Goal 1, to engage the community, is important but must be framed in the context of the environmental protection aim as stated in 1994 when the Local Government Review Board declared that the new Shire of Nillumbik was to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus.
- The plan must state more clearly that the Shire and Green Wedge areas have

particular needs that are different to those in an area not established as a Green Wedge. The new plan presents an opportunity to highlight and expand the role of the whole community in stewardship of the land. This needs to be clearly stated and emphasised, as we ask ourselves, 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?', rather than 'What can we get out of the land?'.

• The community as a whole must come together to ensure serious action is taken to mitigate climate change and draw down carbon emissions. This is a top priority for how we live together as a community – our collective wellbeing depends on it, as does the environment.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

- The Objectives and Key Actions for Goal 2 must clearly and strongly focus on ensuring Nillumbik's biodiversity is top priority. As stated in the draft plan, green space is an important determinant of health, not just because it enables physical activity but also because it has been shown to promote higher levels of mental wellbeing and social connectedness.
- In order to better manage the natural environment of the Shire, greater dialogue must be generated and maintained with the Traditional Custodians of the area. This is vital for the health of the whole community and the environment in which we live. A Key Action of Goal 2 must focus on this.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

The GWMP needs to more strongly acknowledge the importance of ALL indigenous vegetation and address the urgent need to conserve it THROUGHOUT the Shire, on private and public land. The community must work together to focus on increasing habitat for wildlife and connectivity; preserving biodiversity; valuing what ecosystems provide; developing a 'systems view' (that ALL is interdependent); address the climate change and extinction crises, and the need to transform to an ecologically sustainable society. This must become the underpinning ethos that guides the Actions and all other aspects of the plan, without compromise.

• Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, while international, national, and

state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment. For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained.

- The use of stocktakes and studies [see A3.1, p32] that describe some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others is alarming as it can lead to greater degradation of the environment which is already under pressure. The majority of the Shire's ecosystems are already 'disturbed' because of mismanagement, and this means we must change our ways. Every Objective and Action ought to aim for preservation and reinvigoration of the environment. One of the greatest threats to the Shire is 'death by a thousand cuts', where bit by bit land clearing and grazing leave our flora and fauna vulnerable to ever- increasing stress and disappearance. In turn this also places greater pressure on our community's overall well being.
- An additional Action must be to undertake a massive public education campaign about biodiversity, the value of ecosystems, care for natural landscapes, bushfire risk reduction through understanding the ancient role of fire in the landscape, the significance of the Green Wedge, climate change and their interdependence.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4?

This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'.

- Support for local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming including water conservation, Indigenous knowledge, and indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged. The obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge, must be central to the GWMP.
- The need for a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices is described in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, entitled 'Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan', and so this has to be clearly demonstrated in any GWMP. This current draft does not achieve this requirement.
- The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required if the land has been previously cleared and used for farming. This definition of 'cleared land' needs greater detail much of Nillumbik has been cleared at some stage, but thanks to regeneration it holds significant environmental qualities. Permits are essential as they can ensure any agricultural activities respect the

land. It also means that residents will be informed about the piggery etc proposed for next door.

- This draft must mention the fact that tourism developments in the Green Wedge need to be "in conjunction" with agricultural uses, as stated in Section 55 of the planning scheme. This clause of the planning scheme decreases the likelihood of inappropriate development.
- Horses and other hard-hoofed animals have a negative impact on the environment none of Australia's native animals have hard hooves. Impacts on habitats include erosion, water quality degradation, damage to flora, and spreading of weeds. Actions must be implemented to prevent these impacts. These must include education of the equine sector and other graziers. There needs to be greater understanding and responsible ownership of animals, ensuring that animals do not enter waterways and are not allowed to graze in the bush. This focus on environmental care must also be reflected in the proposed Nillumbik Equine Strategy.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? Stewardship of the land is mentioned in the draft plan, and its role must be better defined in Goal 5, Responsible Leadership. It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents about these matters, and lead the way by increasing revegetation of indigenous flora throughout the Shire.

- This draft plan suggests the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices and this zoning should only be applied to land with higher conservation values. This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less.
- Responsible Leadership should have a section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle.
- Council ought to provide education and free, easily accessible advice to residents on a range of topics such as 'avoid reduce reuse recycle', reducing meat-consumption, buying local produce and growing your own, responsible waste disposal, reduction of car-dependence, benefits of native vegetation etc.
- This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP Plan Melbourne 2017-2050). It is Council's responsibility to

make significant contributions to the education of residents for the protection and care of biodiversity. Alongside education, it is essential that appropriate resources are allocated to the enforcement of policy standards. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report outlines the ongoing loss of native vegetation and part of the problem is inadequate enforcement.

- Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary.
- The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role that Nillumbik can play; that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

The strongest message from the initial community consultation and the Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it to be maintained, protected and reinvigorated. This message must lay the foundation for any new GWMP. The current draft does not achieve this.

- The Green Wedge Management Plan must reaffirm the Shire's conservation role with the Green Wedge as its Strategic Focus. This draft consistently fails to do this. It lacks detail and omits significant objectives, relevant actions, and accountability measures that would ensure the long-term health and purpose of the Green Wedge.
- Declines in biodiversity are at critical levels, and there is urgent need for action by all levels of government and society. The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) states that, "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide. It is not too late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global".
- There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included which will address this problem to ensure the long term health of the Green Wedge.
- The impact of invasive species flora and fauna is significant and this must be better addressed.
- The draft speaks of polarised and diverse views and how conversations must be respectful and robust. It is vital that this is the case, and is supported by current science, particularly in relation to the need for environmental repair and preservation, and urgent climate change mitigation.

Engaging the community is important but should be framed in the context of environment protection. The shire was set up to be a conservation shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?' should be the focus rather than 'What can we get out of the land?' Working together to mitigate climate change is important. Green Wedge areas have specific needs different to land in a normal rural shire and this must be made clear.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2? Green space is an important determinant of health. The shire's biodiversity is an important feature of this and should be given high priority. Dialogue with traditional custodians is important.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

The importance of conserving all indigenous vegetation, both on public and private land, should be stressed. 'Balance' is used widely, however if environmental values are not uppermost other activities will inevitably suffer in the longer term. Bit by bit land clearing and grazing leaves plants and animals vulnerable to ever increasing stress and disappearance. Most land is 'disturbed' which does not mean it should be allowed to further degrade. An extensive public education campaign regarding biodiversity, ecosystems, bushfire reduction strategies, climate change etc and their interdependence should be included here

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

Overall environmental protection must be the clear focus. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. Goal 4 should be renamed A prosperous Green Wedge economy. Support for local agriculture is important but the obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge must be central to the GWMP. This draft does not clearly show how sustainable land management practices will be encouraged as is required by State Planning. This draft suggests that no permit would be required to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone if the land has been previously cleared and farmed. Terminology needs to be clearer defined. Permits should be required. The draft must state that tourism developments must be 'in conjunction' with agricultural uses. This is stated in the

Planning Scheme and is necessary to lessen the likelihood for inappropriate development. Horses and other hard hoofed animals have a negative effect on the environment. Actions, including education of those involved with those animals must be implemented.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

Responsible stewardship requires that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents and lead the way. This draft suggests that the Rural Conservation Zone be redefined to only cover areas of higher conservation values putting at risk scattered pockets of remnant bush or sole trees which are actually in greater need of protection. Climate change mitigation should be included. Council should provide education on a range of sustainable, environmentally friendly living practices. It is council's role to significantly contribute to educating residents regarding the protection and care of biodiversity and to provide the resources to enforce policy standards. The draft proposes changes to land uses in the GW which could erode the values of the GW and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the urban Growth Boundary. The UGB should remain as a hard line. The draft should recognize the role Nillumbik can play locally in attacking global problems.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

I'm unclear on the need for a review of the existing Green Wedge Management Plan, despite it still having a considerable period to run. During the 2018 review, the community was surveyed on attitudes to our Green Wedge and a forty-person community panel met over several weeks. Both came up with similar results: the natural environment of the Green Wedge, including flora and fauna, were highly valued and must be protected. Recommendations on this went to Council - half were rejected - why? I'm concerned that this draft Green Wedge Management Plan will take us in the wrong direction. The existing one should be kept because it's much better. We don't need more tourism development. I am also against allowing more development on rural land next to the Urban Growth Boundary and around township boundaries. I'm in favour of stopping general biodiversity and habitat loss across our Green Wedge, including protecting remnant native vegetation to help mitigate climate change or restore wildlife corridors to help species survive. I strongly believe that we should protect our Green

Wedge landscape values and reduce development pressure in our Green Wedge to ensure a sustainable future of the environment. That is why I chose to live here.

I quite honestly love living in the Shire of Nillumbik. The green wedge is one of the greatest decisions in planning I've seen. It must be preserved. My first home was in Mernda, with more houses crammed in than seem feasible. I now live with space around me, native wildlife up to the back fence, rolling hills of trees from my balcony. The area is quiet, relaxing and peaceful and is the reason I choose to raise my family here.

Our shire is worth protecting, the feel of it is worth protecting, and I am in favour of the endeavours writ large but I am incredibly concerned about the development of our areas and packing more people in. The system works now because the services, roads etc are appropriate for the population. If we rezone everything, clear land, pack more people in it will ruin the feel, the lifestyle, the appeal, the value, the quality of life and services in our area.

 Environmental protection and reinvigoration must be central to the Vision for the Green Wedge. The draft does not state this strongly enough, despite it being a Strategic Focus for the Shire. Appendix 1 of Council's draft quotes the State Government's 'Plan Melbourne 2017-2050', where the first priority for the Green Wedge is to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." • Council's initial community engagement clearly demonstrated that the large majority of Nillumbik residents cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it maintained, protected and enhanced. This view was also expressed by the majority report of the Community Panel. Council's draft does not reflect strong enough support for the Community's position. • The GWMP must reflect the fact that Nillumbik's Green Wedge is the most environmentally intact of Melbourne's Green Wedges, is a significant part of the wider Green Wedge system, and is for the benefit of everyone, whether they live in the area or not. • Climate change mitigation must be an overarching Goal for the GWMP and therefore must be addressed in the Vision. It must inform all objectives and actions such as regenerative agriculture, fire management, waste management, bush regeneration,

education, and economic strategy. Throughout the draft, the repeated mention of just adapting to climate change leaves the reader with the impression that Council has basically thrown their hands up in the air suggesting there is nothing that they nor Nillumbik residents can do to tackle climate change. This is not true and must be part of everyday action. • It is vital that Nillumbik demonstrates its respect of Indigenous people, their cultural heritage and knowledge. This barely gets a mention in the GWMP despite the fact that Indigenous people have ensured the vitality of the area's biodiversity for tens of thousands of years.

It appears that Council has failed to follow State Government policy requirements in the preparation of the GWMP. This throws into question the entire document and associated processes. Planning Practice Note 31 describes specific requirements for the development of a GWMP, including the establishment of a Project Steering Group chaired by Council with key stakeholder representatives. This did not occur. • This draft fails to clearly articulate an Implementation Plan based on clearly stated Objectives and Actions and the Council Department responsible for implementation. As stated in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, 'Each GWMP will set out a series of actions and measures that need to be undertaken, and identify resource requirements, roles and responsibilities, timelines, outcomes and evaluation.' The current GWMP has much greater detail than this new draft, and should be used as a basis for improvement. • Each of the 'Five Key Moves' contain potentially useful ideas depending on how they are applied, and there needs to be much greater emphasis on the care of the natural

environment. • The document needs to describe in much greater detail the ACTIONS to be taken, and each of these must prioritise best environmental practice, ensuring the protection of ALL native vegetation and fauna across the Shire. • Every descriptor needs to clearly indicate how it will contribute to the protection and reinvigoration of biodiversity for the long term. • The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the ways Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of vegetation. This demonstrates that any new plan must be stronger and clearer about the actions which will be taken to reverse this ongoing decline. The draft GWMP does not achieve this.

Each Principle is a very broad statement and it is unclear how they will be interpreted and applied while ensuring care for the environment. • The Principles need to reflect the community's commitment to protecting the Green Wedge. The GWMP must describe how the values of the Green Wedge will be prioritised in keeping with the State Government's policies Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 and Protecting Victoria's Environment - Biodiversity 2037, which is 'Victoria's plan to stop the decline of our native plants and animals and improve our natural environment so it is healthy, valued and actively cared for.' • An additional Principle that focuses on Preservation of Environment and Biodiversity, and describes the urgent need to reverse the decline of biodiversity and effects of climate change should be added to the GWMP. Biodiversity Protection should be given the status of a Goal in the Plan. • As with the 'Five Key Moves', the outlined Principles contain potentially useful ideas but there needs to be greater emphasis on the protection of the environment. For example, the principle that says, 'The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its values and with a focus on long-term stewardship.' could read, "The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its biodiversity and environmental values and with a focus on long-term stewardship."

Goal 1: Engaged connected communities

The thrust of Goal 1, to engage the community, is important but must be framed in the context of the environmental protection aim as stated in 1994 when the Local Government Review Board declared that the new Shire of Nillumbik was to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. • The plan must state more clearly that the Shire and Green Wedge areas have particular needs that are different to those in an area not established as a Green Wedge. The new plan presents an opportunity to highlight and expand the role of the whole community in stewardship of the land. This needs to be clearly stated and emphasised, as we ask ourselves, 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?', rather than 'What can we get out of

the land?'. • The community as a whole must come together to ensure serious action is taken to mitigate climate change and draw down carbon emissions. This is a top priority for how we live together as a community – our collective wellbeing depends on it, as does the environment.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

The Objectives and Key Actions for Goal 2 must clearly and strongly focus on ensuring Nillumbik's biodiversity is top priority. As stated in the draft plan, green space is an important determinant of health, not just because it enables physical activity but also because it has been shown to promote higher levels of mental wellbeing and social connectedness. • In order to better manage the natural environment of the Shire, greater dialogue must be generated and maintained with the Traditional Custodians of the area. This is vital for the health of the whole community and the environment in which we live. A Key Action of Goal 2 must focus on this.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

The GWMP needs to more strongly acknowledge the importance of ALL indigenous vegetation and address the urgent need to conserve it THROUGHOUT the Shire, on private and public land. The community must work together to focus on increasing habitat for wildlife and connectivity; preserving biodiversity; valuing what ecosystems provide; developing a 'systems view' (that ALL is interdependent); address the climate change and extinction crises, and the need to transform to an ecologically sustainable society. This must become the underpinning ethos that guides the Actions and all other aspects of the plan, without compromise. • Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, while international, national, and state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment. For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained. • The use of stocktakes and studies [see A3.1, p32] that describe some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others is

alarming as it can lead to greater degradation of the environment which is already under pressure. The majority of the Shire's ecosystems are already 'disturbed' because of mismanagement, and this means we must change our ways. Every Objective and Action ought to aim for preservation and reinvigoration of the environment. One of the greatest threats to the Shire is 'death by a thousand cuts', where bit by bit land clearing and grazing leave our flora and fauna vulnerable to ever increasing stress and disappearance. In turn this also places greater pressure on our community's overall well being. • An additional Action must be to undertake a massive public education campaign about biodiversity, the value of ecosystems, care for natural landscapes, bushfire risk reduction through understanding the ancient role of fire in the landscape, the significance of the Green Wedge, climate change and their interdependence.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Strongly do not support

There should be no focus on economics in the lungs of Melbourne. We cannot use economics and profitability as a measure of the health and well being of a community living in a rich biodiversity of flora and fauna which is priceless and without it we would not be alive as a human species. What is the value of each human life? This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'. • Support for local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming including water conservation, Indigenous knowledge, and indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged. The obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge, must be central to the GWMP. • The need for a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices is described in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, entitled 'Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan', and so this has to be clearly demonstrated in any GWMP. This current draft does not achieve this requirement. • The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required if the land has been previously cleared and used for farming. This definition of 'cleared land' needs greater detail - much of Nillumbik has been cleared at some stage, but thanks to regeneration it holds significant environmental qualities. Permits are essential as they can ensure any agricultural activities respect the land. It also means that residents will be informed about the piggery etc proposed for next door. • This draft must mention the fact that tourism developments in the Green Wedge need to be "in conjunction" with agricultural uses, as stated in Section 55 of the planning scheme. This clause of the planning scheme decreases the likelihood of inappropriate

development. • Horses and other hard-hoofed animals have a negative impact on the environment – none of Australia's native animals have hard hooves. Impacts on habitats include erosion, water quality degradation, damage to flora, and spreading of weeds. Actions must be implemented to prevent these impacts. These must include education of the equine sector and other graziers. There needs to be greater understanding and responsible ownership of animals, ensuring that animals do not enter waterways and are not allowed to graze in the bush. This focus on environmental care must also be reflected in the proposed Nillumbik Equine Strategy

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? Stewardship of the land is mentioned in the draft plan, and its role must be better defined in Goal 5, Responsible Leadership. It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents about these matters, and lead the way by increasing revegetation of indigenous flora throughout the Shire. • This draft plan suggests the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices and this zoning should only be applied to land with higher conservation values. This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less. • Responsible Leadership should have a section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle. • Council ought to provide education and free, easily accessible advice to residents on a range of topics such as 'avoid - reduce - reuse - recycle', reducing meat-consumption, buying local produce and growing your own, responsible waste disposal, reduction of car-dependence, benefits of native vegetation etc. • This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP - Plan Melbourne 2017-2050). It is Council's responsibility to make significant contributions to the education of residents for the protection and care of biodiversity. Alongside education, it is essential that appropriate resources are allocated to the enforcement of policy standards. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report outlines the ongoing loss of native vegetation and part of the problem is inadequate enforcement. • Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary. • The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role

that Nillumbik can play; that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

• The strongest message from the initial community consultation and the Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it to be maintained, protected and reinvigorated. This message must lay the foundation for any new GWMP. The GWMP must reflect the fact that Nillumbik's Green Wedge is the most environmentally intact of Melbourne's Green Wedges, is a significant part of the wider Green Wedge system, and is for the benefit of everyone, whether they live in the area or not. It appears that Council has failed to follow State Government policy requirements in the preparation of the GWMP. This throws into question the entire document and associated processes. Planning Practice Note 31 describes specific requirements for the development of a GWMP, including the establishment of a Project Steering Group chaired by Council with key stakeholder representatives. This did not occur. This could lead to legal action against the council, which I highly doubt it could afford. The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the ways Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of vegetation. This demonstrates that any new plan must be stronger and clearer about the actions which will be taken to reverse this ongoing decline. The draft GWMP does not achieve this.

To engage the community is important, but must be framed in the context of the environmental protection aim as stated in 1994 when the Local Government Review Board declared that the new Shire of Nillumbik was to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. The plan must state more clearly that the Shire and Green Wedge areas have particular needs that are different to those in an area not established as a Green Wedge. The new plan presents an opportunity to highlight and expand the role of the whole community in stewardship of the land. This needs to be clearly stated and emphasised, as we ask ourselves, 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?', rather than 'What can we get out of the land?'.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2? The Objectives and Key Actions must clearly and strongly focus on ensuring Nillumbik's biodiversity is top priority. As stated in the draft plan, green space is an important determinant of health, not just because it enables physical activity but also because it has been shown to promote higher levels of mental wellbeing and social connectedness.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, while international, national, and state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment. For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained. The use of stocktakes and studies [see A3.1, p32] that describe some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others is alarming as it can lead to greater degradation of the environment which is already under pressure. The majority of the Shire's ecosystems are already 'disturbed' because of mismanagement, and this means we must change our ways. Every Objective and Action ought to aim for preservation and reinvigoration of the

environment. One of the greatest threats to the Shire is 'death by a thousand cuts', where bit by bit land clearing and grazing leave our flora and fauna vulnerable to ever-increasing stress and disappearance. In turn this also places greater pressure on our community's overall well being.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4? Excessive development will give only a sugar rush to the local economy, and will not help in the long term. Nillumbik is a green area that people love to move to, chopping down half the green to fit more people in will not help with any potential tourism projects. More housing leads to more run off and contamination of waterways.

Local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming including water conservation, Indigenous knowledge, and indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged. The obvious link between sustainable agricultural practices, climate change mitigation and a healthy Green Wedge, must be central to the GWMP. The need for a framework that encourages sustainable land management practices is described in the State Government's Planning Practice Note 31, entitled 'Preparing a Green Wedge Management Plan', and so this has to be clearly demonstrated in any GWMP. This current draft does not achieve this requirement.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP - Plan Melbourne 2017-2050). It is Council's responsibility to make significant contributions to the education of residents for the protection and care of biodiversity. Alongside education, it is essential that appropriate resources are allocated to the enforcement of policy standards. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report outlines the ongoing loss of native vegetation and part of the problem is inadequate enforcement. Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development

outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary. Stewardship of the land is mentioned in the draft plan, and its role must be better defined in Goal 5, Responsible Leadership. It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state. Council must educate residents about these matters, and lead the way by increasing revegetation of indigenous flora throughout the Shire.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

The strongest message from the initial community consultation and the Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it to be maintained, protected and reinvigorated. This message must lay the foundation for any new GWMP. The current draft does not achieve this.

The Green Wedge Management Plan must reaffirm the Shire's conservation role with the Green Wedge as its Strategic Focus. This draft consistently fails to do this. It lacks detail and omits significant objectives, relevant actions, and accountability measures that would ensure the long-term health and purpose of the Green Wedge.

Declines in biodiversity are at critical levels, and there is urgent need for action by all levels of government and society. The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) states that, "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide. It is not too late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global".

There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included which will address this problem to ensure the long term health of the Green Wedge. The impact of invasive species – flora and fauna – is significant and this must be better addressed.

There is no clearly articulated Implementation Plan based on clearly stated Objectives and Actions. The current GWMP is better and more detailed than this draft.

There is insufficient emphasis on care of the natural environment.

There is insufficient detail regarding actual actions to be taken to ensure best environmental practice and the protection of all native vegetation and fauna. Every descriptor needs to indicate clearly how it will contribute to the long term protection and improvement of biodiversity.

Nillumbik has experienced a steady decline in native vegetation in recent years. The GWMP should show what steps will be taken to reverse this trend but it does not.

Best practice sustainable agricultural methods should be encouraged wherever farming is done.

It is not appropriate that a permit would not be required to start farming in a previously

cleared area in the RCZ. Much previously cleared land has subsequently developed important habitat values. The need for a permit can help to ensure that the more important of these are preserved and that the land is respected. It is also fair and reasonable that neighbours should be aware and able to object if there are plans to start a piggery or other confronting farming operation nearby.

Stewardship of the land is an important aspect of living in a Green Wedge. Although this is mentioned in Goal 5 it is not given sufficient weight. It should be spelled out that Nillumbik residents have a responsibility to care for the land and pass it on in at least as good condition. The suggestion that the RCZ is too restrictive of farming practices is not in keeping with the aims if a Green Wedge. Flora and fauna must be protected across the Shire, including isolated trees in paddocks and patches of remnant bush. As these are whittled away we lose the character of the Green Wedge along with the integrity of its ecosystems which are often fragile and hanging on locally by the skin of their teeth. Responsible leadership demands educating residents on how best to care for the land they live on and helping them to put this into practice.

There must be no question of allowing "development" outside the UGB.

As a relatively prosperous region, Nillumbik has the opportunity to show leadership in acting locally to set the example in how to tackle global problems like climate change and species loss.

I grew up in Nillumbik but have lived most of my life elsewhere. I have come back here to live because, 30 years after my departure, it is still almost as beautiful as when I left. Appendix 1 of Council's draft quotes the State Government's 'Plan Melbourne 2017-2050', where the first priority for the Green Wedge is to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation."The GWMP must reflect the fact that Nillumbik's Green Wedge is the most environmentally intact of Melbourne's Green Wedges, is a significant part of the wider Green Wedge system, and is for the benefit of everyone, whether they live in the area or not. • Climate change mitigation must be an overarching Goal for the GWMP and therefore must be addressed in the Vision. It must inform all objectives and actions such as regenerative agriculture, fire management, waste management, bush regeneration, education, and economic strategy. Throughout the draft, the repeated mention of just adapting to climate change leaves the reader with the impression that Council has basically thrown their hands up in the air suggesting there is nothing that they nor Nillumbik residents can do to tackle climate change. The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the

ways Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of vegetation. This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required if the land has been previously cleared and used for farming. This definition of 'cleared land' needs greater detail – much of Nillumbik has been cleared at some stage, but thanks to regeneration it holds significant environmental qualities. Horses and other hard-hoofed animals have a negative impact on the environment – none of Australia's native animals have hard hooves. Impacts on habitats include erosion, water quality degradation, damage to flora, and spreading of weeds. Actions must be implemented to prevent these impacts. These must include education of the equine sector and other graziers. There needs to be greater understanding and responsible ownership of animals, ensuring that animals do not enter waterways and are not allowed to graze in the bush.

This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less y. Alongside education, it is essential that appropriate resources are allocated to the enforcement of policy standards. Nillumbik's Biodiversity Report outlines the ongoing loss of native vegetation and part of the problem is inadequate enforcement

Green Wedge. • Declines in biodiversity are at critical levels, and there is urgent need for action by all levels of government and society. The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) states that, "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide. It is not too late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global"There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included which will address this problem to ensure the long term health of the Green Wedge. • The impact of invasive species – flora and fauna - is significant and this must be better addressed. • The draft speaks of polarised and diverse views and how conversations must be respectful and robust. As above, a) there is not enough detail provided on what these principles could mean in practice; and b) there is nothing here about supporting biodiversity and protecting indigenous flora and fauna.

While I appreciate actions A1.9-A1.11, I am deeply concerned about several of the other actions proposed (primarily due to lack of detail provided). For example, A1.5: 'Create a comprehensive planning and place management service for the townships to strengthen their identities and attractiveness as service, population, tourism, community and cultural centres'. Why? So we can attract more visitors? No thank you. So we can attract more residents? No thank you. So we can attract bigger businesses? No, that you.

A1.6: 'Investigate options for consolidation and amalgamation of small rural lots that are not capable of supporting a dwelling in their current configuration. Where appropriate and with owner consent, consider government purchase of such lots where they are adjacent to public land'. Again, why? In order to do what? There are two inferences that can be drawn from this, 1) so more dwellings can be built (which I would strongly oppose) or 2) to expand the amount of public land (which I would support, but with caveats regarding protection of biodiversity & of indigenous flora and fauna & regarding land usage. I want the bush to be protected because of its importance in our ecosystem, not because it can then become a product for 'consumption'.)

A1.7 'Review the impacts of proximity to urban communities on rural land adjoining the urban area and investigate options to maintain the amenity and productivity of those areas.' Again, why? With what aim in mind? This smacks to me of backdoor introduction of 'buffer' zones, that simply serve to nibble away at the Green Wedge.

The proposed action that concerns me, here, is A2.7: 'Use the Nillumbik Planning Scheme as a positive means to encourage heritage conservation and management, including support of adaptive reuse of heritage places and allowing prohibited uses, if they help support the conservation of a heritage place and are in line with planning policy objectives.' There is insufficient detail provided, which rings alarm bells for me. If conserving a heritage place means over-riding environmental protections (regardless of whether or not this is in line with planning policy objectives), then I would be opposed to such conservation.

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? I am delighted to see reference, here, to a) feral animal and pest plan specifies reduction (A3.4); b) biodiversity conservation and working with Landcare groups (A3.5); c) renewable energy solutions (A3.11).

However I am strongly opposed to any review of the Environmental Significance Overlay (A3.2), particularly when this is linked to 'agricultural activity and practices'. I am far less concerned about protecting agriculture than I am about protecting biodiversity and the environment.

I also object to the wording of A3.12: 'Promote water sensitive design, balance amenity uses of our waterways with environmental considerations and balance demand for private use of water flows through extraction and diversion with broader community and environmental considerations.' I want broader community and environmental considerations to be prioritised over 'private use of water flows'. We have already seen how badly affected our local waterways are by extraction of water for profit-making enterprises.

I want a Green Wedge zoning policy that better reflects the optimal use of land from a biodiversity and environmental perspective. No agricultural/peri-urban development creep, thank you.

I - and everyone else I know who lives in St Andrews - chooses to live here because of the natural beauty of the surroundings. We are happy to live on tank water, with no sewage service and with unpaved roads. While I object strongly to Nillumbik Council's Eltham-centric resource distribution, my primary desire of the Council is that it works to protect and promote this natural beauty: not for economic benefit, but because of its importance to the ecosystem. The emphases in this "vision" are all wrong and go backwards from the previous "vision" which should be reinstated. The new one seems bereft of any real vision and little more than a long political slogan/motherhood statement that leaves wiggle room to UNDERMINE the Green Wedge by making it secondary to "economic sustainability". This is an egregious betrayal of the process set up by Council allegedly to allow the community to have its views on the subject heard. The Community Survey of August 2018 found widespread support for preserving the Green Wedge, as did the Community Panel, whose conclusions have not been reflected in the draft GWMP - rather the minority report has taken over. How can a viewpoint determined by the Council's own processes as being a minority opinion come to dominate the outcome? The whole point of Green Wedges, from their inception in the 1970s, is to PRESERVE the natural environment, not MANAGE it, or, bend it to suit "economic sustainability". This is made even clearer in the draft GWMP's own appendix 1, when it quotes the priority of Plan Melbourne 2017-2050: "Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." The alleged "vision" will not achieve this, as it is just another fool's paradise

attempt to have one's cake and eat it too, doomed to fail. The "vision" needs to emphasise and make clear the true goals of the Green Wedge, consistent with the Victorian Biodiversity Strategy, namely to conserve and enhance the natural environment of Nillumbik. Council's draft will not only not achieve this but runs a very real risk of doing the opposite.

While potentially useful, the moves seem to put the interests of landowners, community and townships ahead of the environment, which again betrays the Community Panel's recommendations. It's not clear how the moves would actually preserve and enhance the Green Wedge any better than is being done (still inadequately) using the current GWMP 2010 - 2025, which has much more detail than the new draft about how to achieve protection of the Green Wedge. The new plan, let alone these suspicious key moves, does not achieve what it should be aiming at: to make the GWMP stronger.

These principles only raise the level of the alarm bells ringing. They are mostly vague but also all too prone to too much interpretation eg. whose "leadership"? The community's? Council's? The landowners with the biggest bribes?! Whose "future benefit"? What type of "sustainability" - the environment's or the economy's? And why the emphasis on "Nillumbik's relationship to Metropolitan Melbourne" in a plan for the Green Wedge? Too many obvious Green Wedge principles are missing: "preservation and enhancement of the natural environment and its biodiversity (especially indigenous vegetation and wildlife habitat)" should be at the very top of the list, ideally followed by "recognition of the need to change to an ecologically sustainable society". The absence of the obvious principles helps cement the view formed as per previous comments that this new GWMP has too much potential to undermine the Green Wedge and will be a major backwards step in what should be its principal goal: preservation and enhancement of the Green Wedge.

The goal makes some sense and some of its objectives and actions have some merit, but it all puts the cart before the horse... Nillumbik was formed in 1994 with the intent of being a "conservation Shire" with the Green Wedge its strategic focus - communities therefore must accept that restraint to ensure they act as responsible stewards. That objective should be the very first one - but as it is not included, the other objectives and key actions leave themselves open to dealing with the wrong priorities and belong better in an economic plan not a Green Wedge plan. In fact, that seems to be the overarching fault with the entire draft GWMP - it fails to deal properly with its own subject and tries to transform the environmental questions of concern into economic issues. As such, I can only be suspicious that the objectives and actions will effectively work to undermine what should be the real goal of preserving and enhancing the Green Wedge. In particular, I have concerns about O1.2's reliance on "landowners and volunteers" and A1.8's intent for the "location of aged care services within the townships".

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Neutral

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

On the surface, this seems reasonable, but the proof of the pudding is in the detail which is not made clear. The objectives as stated could easily translate to the Shire being inundated with tourists which would work against preserving and enhancing the Green Wedge. Again, these are economic goals that belong elsewhere not in a GWMP.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

Back to front again. Healthy environments first, safe second. Bushfire concerns dominate the objectives but better belong in a Bushfire policy, not the GWMP. 03.5 seems worthy but 03.1 misses the point by its inclusion of the word "valuable" - who determines the value? Government? Landowners? Banks? This and the associated A3.1 could lead to the majority of "biodiversity and habitats" being deemed not "valuable" enough to "protect and enhance", being further degraded, and putting pressure on the more "valuable" remainder. Another back door to undermine the Green Wedge.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4?

Trying to prioritise the economy in a GMWP completely misses the point. You can't have your cake and eat it too. The GWMP must work to preserve and enhance the Green Wedge - that is its fundamental purpose, and everything else secondary and subservient to that purpose. Without a sustainable environment, there can be no economy (ask the Easter Islanders). As such, economic goals belong elsewhere. O4.4 highlights the fundamental dilemma: "sustainable management of the equine community" cannot preserve or enhance the Green Wedge, it can only erode it due to horses' hard hooves eroding land and thus helping to spread weeds and degrade water quality. A4.5 is the only action that makes any sense - it is blank. Of particular concern is the draft GWMP's suggestion that farming should be allowed to start in RCZ zones without permits if the land has already been "cleared" or used for farming - would this mean land farmed half a century ago for crops but left idle since and now full of recovered biodiversity could suddenly be home to a herd of goats? Don't tell the neighbours, maybe they won't notice. Similarly, the draft plan suggests RCZ should only be applied to land with higher conservation values so as to not overly restrict farming practices, an idea that would undoubtedly lead to further degradation in much of the Shire with remnant bush, as is particularly the case in my local area.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? No, no, no. The GWMP's principles, if properly and consistently framed, should provide all the leadership that is necessary. If we could rely on leadership from landowners and the community, there would be no need for a GWMP. Especially A5.6 and A5.7 are

objectionable: the existing zoning controls and land uses near the UGB need to be reinforced not weakened, otherwise there will be continued nibbling at the edges and the Green Wedge will not be preserved and enhanced as the true intention of a GMWP requires but instead undermined. The Planning Scheme's current minimum subdivision size for RCZ of 8ha must be retained WITHOUT EXCEPTION, with only one dwelling on each block.

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

Why has the GWMP even been reviewed (well ahead of schedule, as it was meant to run until 2025)? Apparently, not to better meet its goals of preserving and enhancing the environment, as those goals do not figure in any of the above. Indeed, given that the Green Wedge is meant to be Nillumbik's strategic focus, it is remarkable that the draft GWMP consistently fails to have the Green Wedge as its focus. Council promoted the review process as allowing the community to have its say, but then took on board not the findings of a long consultation and panel process which only affirmed a widespread community desire to preserve and enhance the Green Wedge and thus fulfil Nillumbik's role as a conservation Shire, but instead a minority report from disgruntled panel members. The result is a poorly framed draft policy far inferior to its predecessor, bereft of the obvious foundation of environmental protection, and capable only of eroding the Green Wedge. If the (majority) Panel recommendations cannot be acted upon to actually IMPROVE on the current GWMP, it would be best to allow the current one to run until its conclusion in 2025, and abandon the new draft in its entirety.

Each of the 'Five Key Moves' contain potentially useful ideas depending on how they are applied, but there needs to be much greater emphasis on the care of the natural environment.

The document needs to describe in much greater detail the ACTIONS to be taken, and each of these must prioritise best environmental practice, ensuring the protection of ALL native vegetation and fauna across the Shire.

Every descriptor needs to clearly indicate how it will contribute to the protection and reinvigoration of biodiversity for the long term.

The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the ways Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of vegetation. This demonstrates that any new plan must be stronger and clearer about the actions which will be taken to reverse this ongoing decline. The draft GWMP does not achieve this.

Each Principle is a very broad statement and it is unclear how they will be interpreted and applied, and that enough care will be taken for the environment.

The Principles need to reflect the community's commitment to protecting the Green Wedge, which it doesn't in this draft. The GWMP plan must describe how the values of the Green Wedge will be prioritised in keeping with the State Government's policies Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 and Protecting Victoria's Environment – Biodiversity 2037, which is 'Victoria's plan to stop the decline of our native plants and animals and improve our natural environment so it is healthy, valued and actively cared for.'

An additional Principle that focuses on Preservation of Environment and Biodiversity, and describes the urgent need to reverse the decline of biodiversity and effects of climate change should be added to the GWMP.

As with the 'Five Key Moves', the outlined Principles contain potentially useful ideas but there needs to be greater emphasis on the protection of the environment. For example, the principle that says, 'The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its values and with a focus on long-term stewardship.' could read, "The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its *biodiversity and environmental* values and with a focus on long-term stewardship." This draft is clearly a weak document which fails to make a strong enough commitment to environmental protections.

The thrust of Goal 1, to engage the community, is important but must be framed in the context of the environmental protection aim as stated in 1994 when the Local Government Review Board declared that the new Shire of Nillumbik was to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

The Objectives and Key Actions for Goal 2 do not clearly and strongly focus on ensuring Nillumbik's biodiversity is top priority. They are too vague and open to interpretation. As stated in the draft plan, green space is an important determinant of health, not just because it enables physical activity but also because it has been shown to promote higher levels of mental wellbeing and social connectedness.

In order to better manage the natural environment of the Shire, greater dialogue must be generated and maintained with the Traditional Custodians of the area. This is vital for the health of the whole community and the environment in which we live. A Key Action of Goal 2 must focus on this.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Strongly do not support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? goal 3 - The GWMP needs to more strongly acknowledge the importance of ALL indigenous vegetation and address the urgent need to conserve it THROUGHOUT the Shire, on private and public land. The community must work together to focus on

increasing habitat for wildlife and connectivity; preserving biodiversity; valuing what ecosystems provide; developing a 'systems view' (acknowledging the fact that ALL is interdependent); address the climate change and extinction crises, and the need to transform to an ecologically sustainable society. This must become the underpinning ethos that guides the Actions and all other aspects of the plan, without compromise. Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, which is wrong - and creates divisiveness. In fact, international, national, and state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment and human health and well-being will only benefit as a result.

For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained.

- The use of stocktakes and studies [see A3.1, p32] that describe some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others is alarming as it can lead to greater degradation of the environment which is already under pressure. The majority of the Shire's ecosystems are already 'disturbed' because of mismanagement, and this means we must change our ways. Every Objective and Action ought to aim for preservation and reinvigoration of the environment. One of the greatest threats to the Shire is 'death by a thousand cuts', where bit by bit land clearing and grazing leave our flora and fauna vulnerable to ever- increasing stress and disappearance. In turn this also places greater pressure on our community's overall well being.
- An additional Action must be to undertake a massive public education campaign about biodiversity, the value of ecosystems, care for natural landscapes, bushfire risk reduction through understanding the ancient role of fire in the landscape, the significance of the Green Wedge, climate change and their interdependence.

The plan takes a very short term view - we cannot gain true prosperity by destroying the land on which we live, no matter how gradual the destruction.

The plan must state more clearly that the Shire and Green Wedge areas have particular needs that are different to those in an area not established as a Green Wedge. The new plan presents an opportunity to highlight and expand the role of the whole community in stewardship of the land. This needs to be clearly stated and emphasised, as we ask ourselves, 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?', rather than 'What can we get out of the land?'.

The true value, including the economic value of the land and the real estate built on it,

will rise if we protect and enhance the trees and all native vegetation- people want and need nature. This is why people whose to live in Eltham - because it doesn't look like Richmond or Balwyn!! There is insufficient detail in the plan and the proposed actions to show real understanding that short term economic goals won't undermine long term real value and prosperity for residents and for the land on which we live.

This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'.

- Support for local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming, Indigenous knowledge, and value indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged.
- The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required if the land has been previously cleared and used for farming. This definition of 'cleared land' needs greater detail much of Nillumbik has been cleared at some stage, but thanks to regeneration it holds significant environmental qualities. Permits are essential as they can ensure any agricultural activities respect the land. It also means that residents will be informed about the piggery etc proposed for next door.
- This draft must mention the fact that tourism developments in the Green Wedge need to be "in conjunction" with agricultural uses, as stated in Section 55 of the planning scheme. This clause of the planning scheme decreases the likelihood of inappropriate development.
- Horses and other hard-hoofed animals have a negative impact on the environment none of Australia's native animals have hard hooves. Impacts on habitats include erosion, water quality degradation, damage to flora, and spreading of weeds. Actions must be implemented to prevent these impacts. These must include education of the equine sector and other graziers. There needs to be greater understanding and responsible ownership of animals, ensuring that animals do not enter waterways and are not allowed to graze in the bush. This focus on environmental care must also be reflected in the proposed Nillumbik Equine Strategy.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state.

- This draft plan suggests the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices and this zoning should only be applied to land with higher conservation values. This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less.
- Responsible Leadership should have a section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle.
- This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP Plan Melbourne 2017-2050).
- Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary.
- The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role that Nillumbik can play; there is a real opportunity now that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

The strongest message which came from the initial community consultation and the Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it to be maintained, protected and reinvigorated. This must lay the foundation for any new GWMP. The current draft does not achieve this, but appears to be deliberately weakening the commitment to protect and manage our natural environment and allow greater development for short term economic Gail.

- There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included which will clearly state a genuine commitment to the long term health of the Green Wedge.
- Declines in biodiversity are at critical levels, and there is urgent need for action by all levels of government and society. The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) states that, "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide. It is not too late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global". We need the Shire to get their heads out of the sand

and accept this reality and the need for genuine leadership.

- The impact of invasive species flora and fauna is significant and this must be better addressed.
- The Green Wedge Management Plan must reaffirm the Shire's true conservation role this must be central, not peripheral.
- The draft speaks of polarised and diverse views, and how conversations must be respectful and robust. Yes as it stands it perpetuates this fallacy that environmental and [true sustainable] economic values are at odds the former will contribute to the latter they are inextricably connected.
- . Leadership must take into account the current science, particularly in relation to the need for environmental repair and preservation. There is no room for antiquated arguments the science is unequivocal. Both elected and employed Shire leaders have a moral responsibility to act in the best interests of all current and future residents, informed by science.

Appendix 1 of Council's draft quotes the State Government's 'Plan Melbourne 2017-2050', where the first priority for the Green Wedge is to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." • Council's initial community engagement clearly demonstrated that the large majority of Nillumbik residents cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it maintained, protected and enhanced. This view was also expressed by the majority report of the Community Panel. Council's draft does not reflect strong enough support for the Community's position.

• Each of the 'Five Key Moves' contain potentially useful ideas depending on how they are applied, and there needs to be much greater emphasis on the care of the natural environment. • The document needs to describe in much greater detail the ACTIONS to be taken, and each of these must prioritise best environmental practice, ensuring the protection of ALL native vegetation and fauna across the Shire. • Every descriptor needs to clearly indicate how it will contribute to the protection and reinvigoration of biodiversity for the long term. • The current GWMP 2010 - 2025 describes in much greater detail (than the new draft) the ways Council and community will ensure the protection of the green wedge. However there has been consistent net loss of vegetation. This demonstrates that any new plan must be stronger and clearer about the actions which will be taken to reverse this ongoing decline. The draft GWMP does not achieve this.

• Each Principle is a very broad statement and it is unclear how they will be interpreted and applied while ensuring care for the environment. • The Principles need to reflect the community's commitment to protecting the Green Wedge. The GWMP plan must describe how the values of the Green Wedge will be prioritised in keeping with the State Government's policies Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 and Protecting Victoria's Environment - Biodiversity 2037, which is 'Victoria's plan to stop the decline of our native plants and animals and improve our natural environment so it is healthy, valued and actively cared for.' • An additional Principle that focuses on Preservation of Environment and Biodiversity, and describes the urgent need to reverse the decline of biodiversity and effects of climate change should be added to the GWMP. • As with the 'Five Key Moves', the outlined Principles contain potentially useful ideas but there needs to be greater emphasis on the protection of the environment. For example, the principle that says, 'The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its values and with a focus on long-term stewardship.' could read, "The green wedge is a changing environment and home to many people. Change will be managed to conserve its biodiversity and environmental values and with a focus on long-term stewardship."

• The thrust of Goal 1, to engage the community, is important but must be framed in the context of the environmental protection aim as stated in 1994 when the Local Government Review Board declared that the new Shire of Nillumbik was to be a conservation Shire with the Green Wedge as its strategic focus. • The plan must state more clearly that the Shire and Green Wedge areas have particular needs that are different to those in an area not established as a Green Wedge. The new plan presents an opportunity to highlight and expand the role of the whole community in stewardship of the land. This needs to be clearly stated and emphasised, as we ask ourselves, 'How can we maintain and reinvigorate the environment?', rather than 'What can we get out of the land?'.

Goal 2: Active and creative people

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 2? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 2?

• The Objectives and Key Actions for Goal 2 must clearly and strongly focus on ensuring Nillumbik's biodiversity is top priority. As stated in the draft plan, green space is an important determinant of health, not just because it enables physical activity but also because it has been shown to promote higher levels of mental wellbeing and social connectedness. • In order to better manage the natural environment of the Shire, greater dialogue must be generated and maintained with the Traditional Custodians of the area. This is vital for the health of the whole community and the environment in which we live. A Key Action of Goal 2 must focus on this.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 3? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3?

• The GWMP needs to more strongly acknowledge the importance of ALL indigenous vegetation and address the urgent need to conserve it THROUGHOUT the Shire, on

private and public land. The community must work together to focus on increasing habitat for wildlife and connectivity; preserving biodiversity; valuing what ecosystems provide; developing a 'systems view' (that ALL is interdependent); address the climate change and extinction crises, and the need to transform to an ecologically sustainable society. This must become the underpinning ethos that guides the Actions and all other aspects of the plan, without compromise. • Goal 3 repeatedly uses the language of 'balance', and this needs to be amended as it indicates that our thinking is oppositional. It implies that there is a need to trade-off environmental health against other considerations, while international, national, and state government reports indicate that we must prioritise the health of our environment. For example, A3.12, p 33, speaks of balancing amenity, environmental considerations, private water extraction and community considerations. What needs to take place is a prioritisation of environmental considerations, as without optimal environmental health, all other activity and considerations will be constrained. • The use of stocktakes and studies [see A3.1, p32] that describe some areas of vegetation as more significant or valuable than others is alarming as it can lead to greater degradation of the environment which is already under pressure. The majority of the Shire's ecosystems are already 'disturbed' because of mismanagement, and this means we must change our ways. Every Objective and Action ought to aim for preservation and reinvigoration of the environment. One of the greatest threats to the Shire is 'death by a thousand cuts', where bit by bit land clearing and grazing leave our flora and fauna vulnerable to ever-increasing stress and disappearance. In turn this also places greater pressure on our community's overall well being. • An additional Action must be to undertake a massive public education campaign about biodiversity, the value of ecosystems, care for natural landscapes, bushfire risk reduction through understanding the ancient role of fire in the landscape, the significance of the Green Wedge, climate change and their interdependence.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 4? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 4?

• This section must clearly focus on overall environmental protection. Economic activities must be assessed and altered in response to latest science and the urgent need for environmental protections. This must be reflected in the title of the Goal, the Actions, and throughout the plan, for example, 'A prosperous eco-friendly Green Wedge economy'. • Support for local agriculture is important but must always provide for the continuing health of the environment. New systems that respect and promote regenerative farming, Indigenous knowledge, and value indigenous flora and fauna must be encouraged. • The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required if the land has been previously cleared and used for farming. This definition of 'cleared land' needs greater detail – much of Nillumbik has been cleared at some stage, but thanks to regeneration it holds significant

environmental qualities. Permits are essential as they can ensure any agricultural activities respect the land. It also means that residents will be informed about the piggery etc proposed for next door. • This draft must mention the fact that tourism developments in the Green Wedge need to be "in conjunction" with agricultural uses, as stated in Section 55 of the planning scheme. This clause of the planning scheme decreases the likelihood of inappropriate development. • Horses and other hard-hoofed animals have a negative impact on the environment – none of Australia's native animals have hard hooves. Impacts on habitats include erosion, water quality degradation, damage to flora, and spreading of weeds. Actions must be implemented to prevent these impacts. These must include education of the equine sector and other graziers. There needs to be greater understanding and responsible ownership of animals, ensuring that animals do not enter waterways and are not allowed to graze in the bush. This focus on environmental care must also be reflected in the proposed Nillumbik Equine Strategy.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

To what extent do you support the objectives and key actions for Goal 5? Do not Support

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5?

• Stewardship of the land is mentioned in the draft plan, and its role must be better defined in Goal 5, Responsible Leadership. It needs to explain that Nillumbik residents have an obligation to care for the land, not degrade it, and this must be for the entirety of their tenure. Responsible stewardship also asks that the land, its diverse ecosystems and waterways, are passed on in a better state. • This draft plan suggests the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices and this zoning should only be applied to land with higher conservation values. This suggestion puts at serious risk flora and fauna across a significant proportion of the Shire, whether as single trees in paddocks or scattered pockets of remnant bush. These are all vital and in need of greater care and protection, not less. • Responsible Leadership should have a section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle. • This Goal in its entirety must place much greater emphasis on the need to 'Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation.' (Refer 1st item in Appendix 1 of draft GWMP - Plan Melbourne 2017-2050). • Key Action A5.6 and A5.7 [page 40 of the draft] propose changes to how land within the Green Wedge can be used. This has the potential to erode the values of the Green Wedge and effectively increase the spread of residential and commercial development outside the Urban Growth Boundary. The UGB must be treated as a hard boundary. • The GWMP needs to recognise the leading role that Nillumbik can play; that we can be part of the solution, acting locally to address global problems. We're a relatively affluent population. Nillumbik is the perfect place to start turning things around. If not here and now, where and when?

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

• The strongest message from the initial community consultation and the Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents and the population of wider Melbourne cherish the high environmental values of the Green Wedge and want it to be maintained, protected and reinvigorated. This message must lay the foundation for any new GWMP. The current draft does not achieve this. • There is a worrying lack of detail throughout the document regarding the protection and enhancement of the Shire's biodiversity in all its forms and varying quality. Clearly defined actions need to be included which will address this problem to ensure the long term health of the Green Wedge. • Declines in biodiversity are at critical levels, and there is urgent need for action by all levels of government and society. The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) states that, "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide. It is not too late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global". • The impact of invasive species – flora and fauna – is significant and this must be better addressed. • The Green Wedge Management Plan must reaffirm the Shire's conservation role. • The draft speaks of polarised and diverse views and how conversations must be respectful and robust. It is vital that this is the case, and is supported by current science, particularly in relation to the need for environmental repair and preservation. It is necessary that we uphold the highest of professional standards throughout the Shire and its Leadership.

It sounds like you want to talk about trade off's - yet again this is a fence sitting statement that cannot be supported without stating your actual priorities.

I would need to understand if the overall aim was to enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation - or to trade it off at any opportunity. DO NOT SUPPORT

Still no mention, in this section of the GWMP of maintaining and enhanceing the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation. Studies show that the natural environment, "the bush", has a positive influence on the mental and physical health for regular visitors to, and residents of, the bush. This needs (with the evidence) to be reflected in the Key Actions.

Goal 3: Safe and healthy environments

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 3? I think this is where most survey respondents would expect to see their issues addressed. To that end I think it would be good to reference directly Plan Melbourne 2017-2050, which provides the desired planning outcomes for Green Wedges and periurban areas and has the directive to "Maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species, and achieve a Net Gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation." This draft plan does not provide sufficient emphasis on biodiversity protection, which should be the primary Objective of this Draft Plan. • (O3.1) While it is important to protect our "valuable" biodiversity and habitats, this skirts around the importance of "less valuable" or, more accurately, "less intact or disturbed" habitats that make up the entire biodiversity map for the shire. For example, the "vulnerable" Ecological Vegetation Class - Valley Grassy Forest is often degraded within Nillumbik due to its grassy understory lending itself to being readily-available grazing land. This does NOT negate the importance of these otherwise "less valuable" habitats. • It is important to consider vital faunal corridors, which may or may not be currently vegetated OR may support less "valuable" (read: less intact or degraded) habitats. We need to acknowledge that our natural environment is already highly fragmented, so these important corridors may exist, or need to be created, across landscapes that do not contain so-called "valuable" biodiversity and habitats. Dealing with injured wildlife should also be referenced as this is also very stressful for many residents.

Goal 4: A prosperous economy

COUld we also add: • Economic activities must have a net positive impact on the Green Wedge natural environment. • The GWMP supports economic activity suited to the Green Wedge: activity that does not have a negative impact on its environmental values and

characteristic landscapes. • The draft suggests that to start farming in the Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) no permit should be required. The "right to farm" should be supported, but with a permit, so that current landowners know about the piggery etc that may want to start up next door.

Goal 5: Responsible leadership

Do you have any comments about the objectives or key actions for Goal 5? I feel extremely uncomfortable with the the statement "this plan envisages putting more emphasis towards the empowering end of the spectrum" when we have no overriding guiding principles. I would support this approach if the vision was to have "maintain and enhance the diversity of indigenous flora and fauna habitats and species and achieve a net gain in the quantity and quality of native vegetation" added to it. • This Council draft plan suggests Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ) is too restrictive of farming practices ("the right to farm") and that its coverage should be reduced to land primarily with vegetation deserving of conservation. This puts at risk scattered areas of bushland and tree cover (e.g. the threatened paddock trees) not covered by the broad brush mapping of zones. Responsible leadership would address this obvious problem. • Nillumbik leaders should explain that "the right to farm" comes with an obligation on the owner to not degrade the land during his/her brief period of stewardship. Stewardship simply means that after an owner's (brief) tenure the land and its waterways will be passed on in a better state. For agricultural land this means with soil erosion and pest invasion controlled; for bush properties, biodiversity has been improved. Nillumbik Landcare Network have produced a document on the Culture of Community Custodianship of Land which explains this concept. • Council should call on advice of experts in related fields and the requirements of relevant state policies such as Practice Note 31 and the recent DELWP report on Protecting Melbourne's strategic agricultural land. • Responsible Leadership would have a separate section dealing with climate change mitigation in accordance with the precautionary principle. • The UGB is a hard boundary and should be kept that way as. A5.7 may lead to a push for a buffer zone on the rural side of the UGB. This should be rejected. • The Victorian Green Wedge Planning Zones are aimed at conserving the natural environment of the Green Wedge and this GWMP draft should be supporting the zones not trying to undermine the RCZ and its conservation responsibilities as this draft does. (A5.6 and A5.7)

Other comments

Do you have any other comments about the Draft Green Wedge Management Plan?

The main overriding message from the community engagement exercise and Panel Report is that Nillumbik residents cherish the high environmental values of the GW and they want it to be maintained, protected and enhanced. This strong message is not carried through in any way in the current GWMP draft - almost every statement allows a trade off to be taken. Trading between the self serving and the voiceless is never going to end well for the latter, the voiceless MUST be given more protection. There is a worrying lack of emphasis on the protection and enhancement of the environmental and biodiversity assets in the current Draft GWMP and a major rewrite is required to ensure that this outcome is clearly articulated, emphasised and supported. The current declines in biodiversity to critical levels, and the need for strong environmental action by all levels of government and society, has recently come to the fore on many fronts: - o The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide." late to make a difference, but only if we start now at every level from local to global". o The 2018 State of the Environment report for Victoria 26% of Biodiversity indicators are in poor condition and will remain so without intervention. The Plan Melbourne 2017-2050 defines its 1st desired outcome as Environmental and biodiversity assets, including forests and grasslands and clearly calls for the protection and enhancement of these. This is obviously the highest priority of Plan Melbourne 2017-2050, and shows that the green wedges have strong environmental protection to preserve and enhance their natural environments for the benefit of all Melbournians into the future. I think we should adopt best practice on a local basis to address climate change and pursue the protection and restoration of significant sites and wildlife corridors. The current Draft GWMP dos not clearly prioritise climate change, species extinction and the enhancement of our natural environment. Without this clear message we are doomed to failure.

In the meeting at Council, we discussed the following options:-

In particular we are proposing the following for our 20 acres situated adjacent to the Residential area.

- That every area of the GW be looked at specifically and in particular the Hard Edge area which provides the most challenging interface with Residential housing bordering Acreage of no use other than oxygen.
- A fanning approach in terms of land sizes with a change in the Schedule reflecting smaller more manageable and useful lot sizes closer to the hard edge and larger deeper into the GW. Basically a horses for courses approach is needed.
- Roads be our responsibility (Road Scheme) assuming we can create smaller lots under a new schedule.
- Less Layers of council control so that our land can be useful and to have some value moving forwards as opposed to a diminishing value.
- In our particular Area C the average lot size is 2 HA (88%) and the minimum is 8HA which is an anomaly when using blanket decision for the entire GW. A reduction in sizes via Schedule changes is a must at a minimum.
- Nillumbik Council in 2003 examination of Area C specified it be included with the UGB so our suggestions are feasible in that it is a compromise for GW owners on the hard edge, activists and thousands s of road users.
- Smaller lots have worked well in the Plenty area. In particular similarly located land at 1 ACRE in existing zoning have worked exceptionally well for all groups.
- Proximity to existing infrastructure lends itself to smaller lots in our case, schools, railway, bus, major roads. Basically a few hundred meters to Major activity centre.
- No pastoral hope as most of our 20Acres is cleared and has no value from a pastoral sense and any chance of going towards this was squashed by Council when the previous owner applied for a greenhouse and wads refused a permit.
- No environmental impact as per previous studies undertaken.
- Livestock is not optional due to proximity to residential as we border numerous homes.
- More Urban fringe than Rural, a buffering approach will work in so many ways. Consider the minority report as it was more unbiased and reflective of what I'm hoping was the overall objective of this process.
